Cash Prizes Offered by Dalles Merchants for All Farm Products

The Dalles will hold a second Harvest Home Festival this year. Such is the announcement made by a number of prominent merchants, who are desirous of offering some sort of entertainment and selling event to their patrons.

Committees at work have obtained the co-operation of practically all of the business houses, and it is certain that the affair will be even more successful and extensive than the one of last year.

The dates have been set for the week of October 23, which will mean the event will be held October 23, 24 and 25.

For three days the merchants of that city will be hosts to their patrons. Merchandise of all varieties will be greatly reduced in price, stores will be gaily decorated with the festive fall colors, entertainment will be featured every day and a large number of valuable prizes will be given away.

An additional feature this year will be the offering of cash prizes for the best agricultural displays such as potatoes, wheat, corn, grapes, etc. Ranchers coming into town for the festival are requested to bring their displays, which will be placed in shop windows throughout the city. A committee will judge the winners and the cash prizes awarded.

One point, which is being particularly stressed is that special efforts will be made to arrange for appropriate entertainment and the reception of women and children visitors.

With all the roads leading into The Dalles in fine condition, and a fair wave of prosperity sweeping over the vicinity, it is estimated that a large crowd will visit The Dalles during the three day Harvest Home Festival.

SHANGHAI GIVEN UP; ARMISTICE IS SIGNED

Foreign Forces Prepare to Defend Settlement Against Invasion.

Shanghai.—The Chekiang forces defending Shanghai against the attacks of the invading Kiangsu armies surrendered Monday and an armistice was declared between the opposing forces.

Their defeated armies retreating in confusion towards Shanghai, General Lu Yung-Hsiang, military governor of Chekiang province, and his chief aide, General Ho Ping-Ling, defense commissioner of Shanghai, Monday announced they had signed an armistice with the invading Kiangsu forces representing the central government of China.

While the Chekiang army was retreating towards the environs of Shanghai, every unit of foreign defense forces in the city, including United States marines and foreign warships, was being drawn up along the boundaries of the foreign settlement to put up a defense against any attempts on the part of the Kiangsu troops to enter the concession.

The Chekiang forces were torn apart by a revolt in their own ranks about two weeks ago. Until that time they had repelled the attacks of the invading Kiangsu troops and were engaged in an encircling movement near Tai Lake, west of Shanghai, preparing to start a rear attack against the enemy. The revolt was the beginning of the Chekiang defeat.

BRITISH PARLIAMENT DISSOLVED BY KING

London.—Great Britain's first labor government came to an end when by a combination of conservative and liberal votes the house of commons carried a motion demanding that a select committee of the house investigate the action of the attorney-general, Sir Patrick Hastings, in withdrawing prosecution in the case of the communist, James R. Campbell acting editor of the Workers' Weekly charged with inciting his majesty's forces to sedition.

The government declined to accept the motion and treated it as a vote to censure, which, if adopted by the house, would involve an appeal to the country against parliament's verdict.

The house of commons was dissolved and a general election will be held October 29, it was announced after King George held a privy council at Buckingham palace at which he signed a proclamation proroguing parliament.

BRANDEGEE TAKES OWN LIFE

Connecticut Senator, in Financial Trouble, Found Dead in Bath Room. Washington, D. C.—Senator Frank Brandegee of Connecticut, prominent for years among the republican leaders of congress, committed suicide at his home here.

Worried and distracted, his friends said, over financial difficulties, he went to an unused bathroom on the third floor of his house and just before dawn, took his life by inhaling gas.

The coroner, after an investigation returned a verdict finding that the senator had committed suicide.

His body was discovered in a bathroom on the third floor of the house and those who made the discovery were quoted by the police as saying that the dead man still held in his hand a rubber tube which was attached to an open gas jet.

German Loan Taken in 12 Minutes

New York.—Subscription books for America's \$110,000,000 portion of the \$200,000,000 German loan were opened at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning and closed 12 minutes later with an indicated heavy oversubscription. The rest of the bonds will be marketed in Great Britain and other participating nations.

Gasoline Adds Revenue of Idaho. Boise, Idaho.—The gasoline tax law which went into effect in this state April 1, 1928, has netted a revenue of \$783,169.36, or an average of \$40,804.07 monthly.

Ulster Boundary Bill Becomes Law. London.—The house of lords passed the Ulster boundary bill after with drawing amendments to it. The king approved the bill and it became a law.

Beer By Glass Carried in Vancouver. Vancouver, B. C.—Vancouver voters for beer by the glass by a majority of 78 in the provincial general election June 20, according to a recount.

Boston Man Named On Board. Paris.—Thomas Wilson Perkins of Boston was appointed American member of the reparations commission.

King Arthur's Sister. Fata Morgana, in medieval romance, was a fairy, sister of King Arthur. She lived on the Isle of Avalon. The name is also used of a mirage seen in the Strait of Messina, caused by Morgana.

Far-Fetched Deduction. A Chicago optician deduces from spectacles that the wearer "is of nervous, perhaps neurotic tendency, rather intellectual and temperamental, and of sedentary life." This beats Sherlock Holmes.

Persecution for Witchcraft. The extraordinary delusion of witchcraft broke out among the Puritans at Salem, Mass., in 1692, and caused the deaths of twenty persons, nineteen of whom were hanged and one pressed to death. A reaction soon after set in; and, although in January, 1693, three others were condemned, no more executions took place, and soon after all suspected persons were discharged from custody. The responsibility for the Salem atrocities has been put on Cotton Mather, the Puritan theologian. He did much to fan the flame of fury among the New Englanders, and pursued with savage zeal all those persons supposed to be guilty of this crime.

Tolstol's Opinion of Women. In a recently published volume of reminiscences, Alexander Borivovich Goldenweiser, a Russian pianist and an intimate friend of Tolstol, says that one day the great writer, who was perhaps the greatest feminist of the century, remarked to him: "If you won't repeat it, I'll tell you confidentially: women are generally so evil that there is scarcely any difference between a good woman and a bad one." Mr. Goldenweiser apparently does not explain this extraordinary remark, which may have been made in a mood of levity, or perhaps when Tolstol was suffering from indigestion.
