FOCH PAYS TRIBUTE
TO FOUR LEGION MEN

Centralia, Wash. — Marshal Ferdinand Foch, allied commander in the world war, paid tribute in a cablegram received here to four American Legion men who were slain here by Industrial Workers of the World during an Armistice day parade five years ago.

The message to the local American Legion post gave an international aspect to the unveiling of a memorial in Centralia Tuesday in honor of Warren Grimm, Dale Hubbard, Arthur McElfresh and Ben Casagrande, the four slain in the parade.

"I again salute you, my comrades of the American Legion, who have kept, during times of peace, the grand principles which you fought for and maintained in the world war, and may the memory of our four comrades who fell for the honor of their country remain sacred to us all," said Marshal Foch's cable from Paris.

On November 30, 1921, Marshal Foch visited Centralia and placed wreaths on the graves of the four slain legionnaires.

Ibanez is Planning to Bombard Spain. Paris. — Spain will be bombarded shortly after November 20 by two airplanes carrying Vincente Blasco Ibanez' anti-King Alfonso pamphlets, the Spanish author announced here. Ibanez, who recently denounced King Alfonso and the military directorate, said that his anti-monarchist diatribe was due to appear on the 20th of this month. He declared that two airplanes already had been chartered for the purpose of dropping pamphlets over all parts of Spain.
