Duties of Observer readers are truly
grateful for thoughts that prompt many
persons to phone in news items.

Seven new radios have been placed
in Sherman county homes during the
last ten days by Foss & Co. Atwater-
Kent sets have been installed in the
home of Jim Kenny and his brother
Chas. W. Kenny, both residents of
the Boardman district. F.E. Fortner
of this city and his brother Fred R.
Fortner, of Wasco, have also installed
Atwater-Kent sets through the Foss &
Co. agency. In addition to these, Roy
Benson has had a Kennedy installed at
his farm home and Arthur Smith an
Atwater-Kent at his Rutledge farm home
and W. C. Miller an Atwater-Kent at his
farm home east of this city.

A staggering loss in the aggregate
is the amount of grain that is lost and
wasted because of holes in the grain
sacks, and leaking cars. The wagon
or auto truck starts the grain from the
grain fields. Nails, bolts or broken
siding dig into the sacks and many of
the box cars help along the loss with
all kinds of projections. It is the custom
to "plug" these holes with paper, burlap,
grass, etc., instead of sewing up the holes
or re-sacking. When these leaking sacks
are trucked to and from the scales many
of the "plugs" fall out, and then there is
a stream of grain to the scales and from
the scales to the pile. This is repeated in
moving the grain from the pile to the cars,
and often the leakage is increased by
loading the bottom sacks in the car on
edge, resulting in seam splitting.

This big waste and loss could be
very largely eliminated by a little
extra work and attention that would
well pay for itself. Few farmers would
tolerate a like waste on any other
product. When a sack is torn repair it
permanently, and before loading in a car
see that the car is free from spikes and
slivers that will tear the sacks.

Commander Fred M. Perkins, gun-
nery officer of the battle fleet, who was
injured in a crash of his seaplane at San
Pedro, California, December 15th, died at
the naval hospital in that city on Tuesday
morning. He suffered a fracture of the left
lung and a broken leg in the accident and
subsequently contracted double pneumonia.
Commander Perkins was rated by naval
heads as one of the nation's foremost
experts on gunnery, firing and armor. The
plane, in which he was a passenger, had
been catapulted from the United States
battleship California, had made a successful
flight and was returning to the ship when
it went into a spin and crashed. Commander
Perkins is a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. T. Perkins
of Portland. Miss Dorothy Perkins, teacher
of the 3rd and 4th grades in Moro schools, is
a sister.

The last ten days have been continuous
zero weather for Sherman county. At this
place the temperature reading each morning
ranges from one to eight below zero, with
slight upward tendency during the middle
portion of the day. Nearly every house has
been afflicted with frozen water pipes to
some extent and no doubt when warmer
weather approaches numerous broken pipes
will be found. At the present time about
six inches of snow covers the wheat fields
of the county, affording the winter wheat
slight protection from the extreme cold. It
is thought the early snow wheat will come
in fair condition, but the later snow fields
are listed as doubtful.

ADMINISTRATOR'S SALE OF REAL PROPERTY

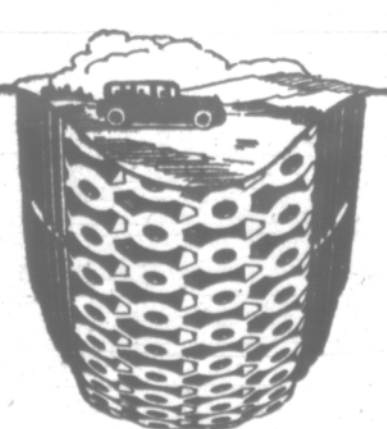
In the County Court of the State of Oregon for the county of Sherman. In the matter of the estate of William R. Schlais, deceased.

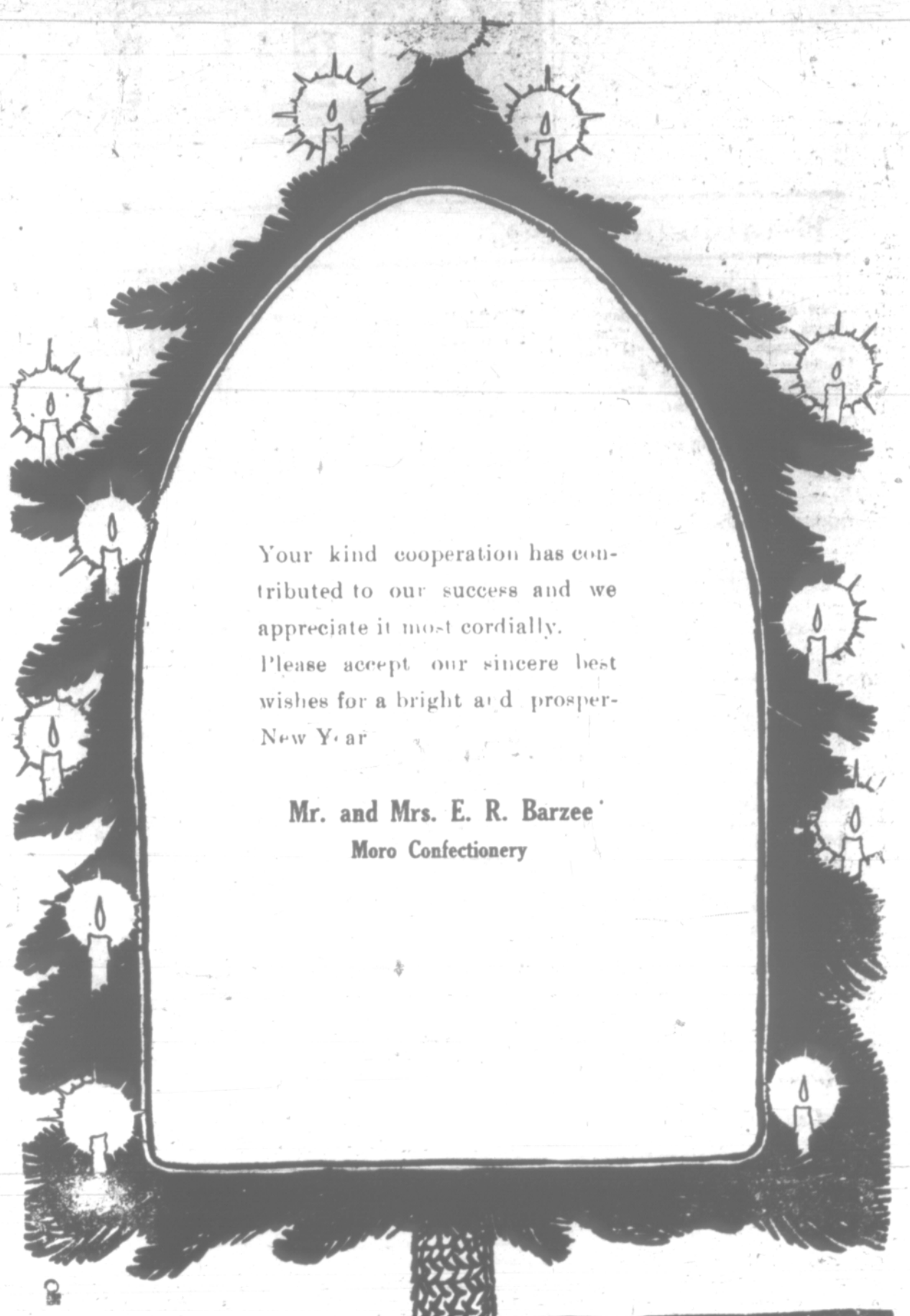

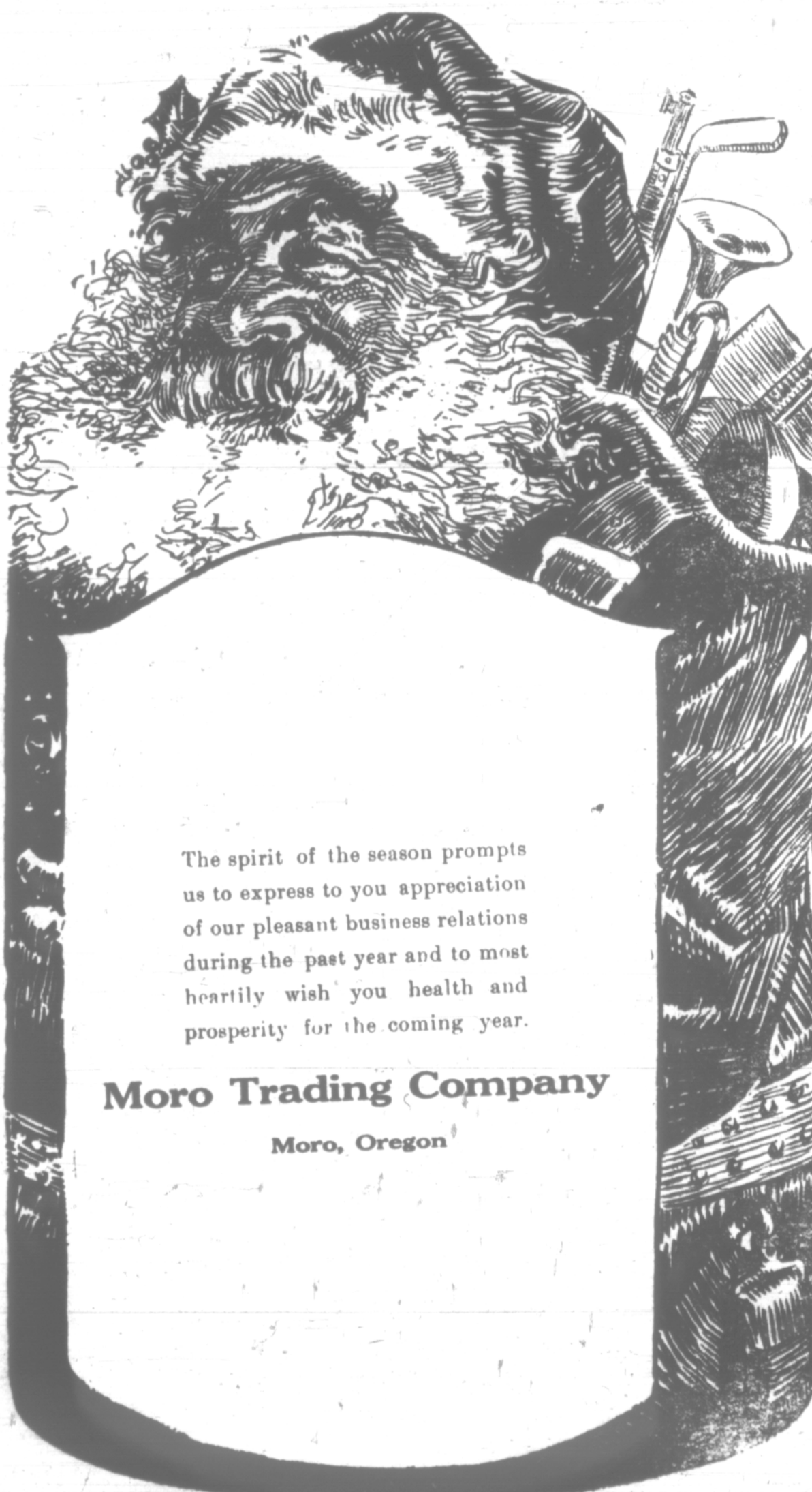
