**OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST**

**Brief Resume of Happenings of the Week Collected for Our Readers**

The Eastern Oregon Dental association held a two-day session at La Grande.

Morris L. Johnson, Klamath county appraiser for the state bonus commission, has resigned.

Burglars entered the general store at Qulnsby and appropriated merchandise valued at \$700.

Captain John Erickson, for 42 years engaged in towboat service on Coos bay, is dead at the age of 77 years.

Riders are rounding up stray horses in Pine valley and holding them for disposition by the sheriff.

Crater Lake national park was the only park in the United States which paid dividends in 1924, according to Colonel C. G. Thomson, superintendent.

With the turning of a 60-inch valve by Mayor Baker at the Bull Run headworks, Portland's new \$2,600,000 pipe line, the third, was placed in commission and the city now has available 65,000,000 additional gallons of water a day.

Machinery for the payment of loans aggregating \$1,500,000 for the relief of eastern Oregon farmers in reseedling purposes began to function when representatives of the board of control left for eastern Oregon cities to complete local arrangements for handling the money. The plan calls for a local committee of five to serve without pay in each district.

The rivers and harbors bill carries an amendment adopted on motion of Senator McNary providing for a preliminary examination and survey of the Columbia and Willamette rivers from Portland to the sea with a view to a widening and deepening of the channel. The project contemplated is the most ambitious yet put forward for any river in the United States except the Mississippi.

The Eugene city council has ordered a special election April 15 to authorize issuance of \$544,000 in bonds for the following purposes: Fifty thousand dollars sewer reconstruction, \$25,000 saw fire apparatus, \$20,000 for paving street intersections, \$375,000 for McKenzie water project, \$125,000 for saw reservoir, mains and pumps, \$10,000 for repairing city hall, \$90,000 for paving street intersections, \$25,000 for lacinerator and \$9000 for paving.

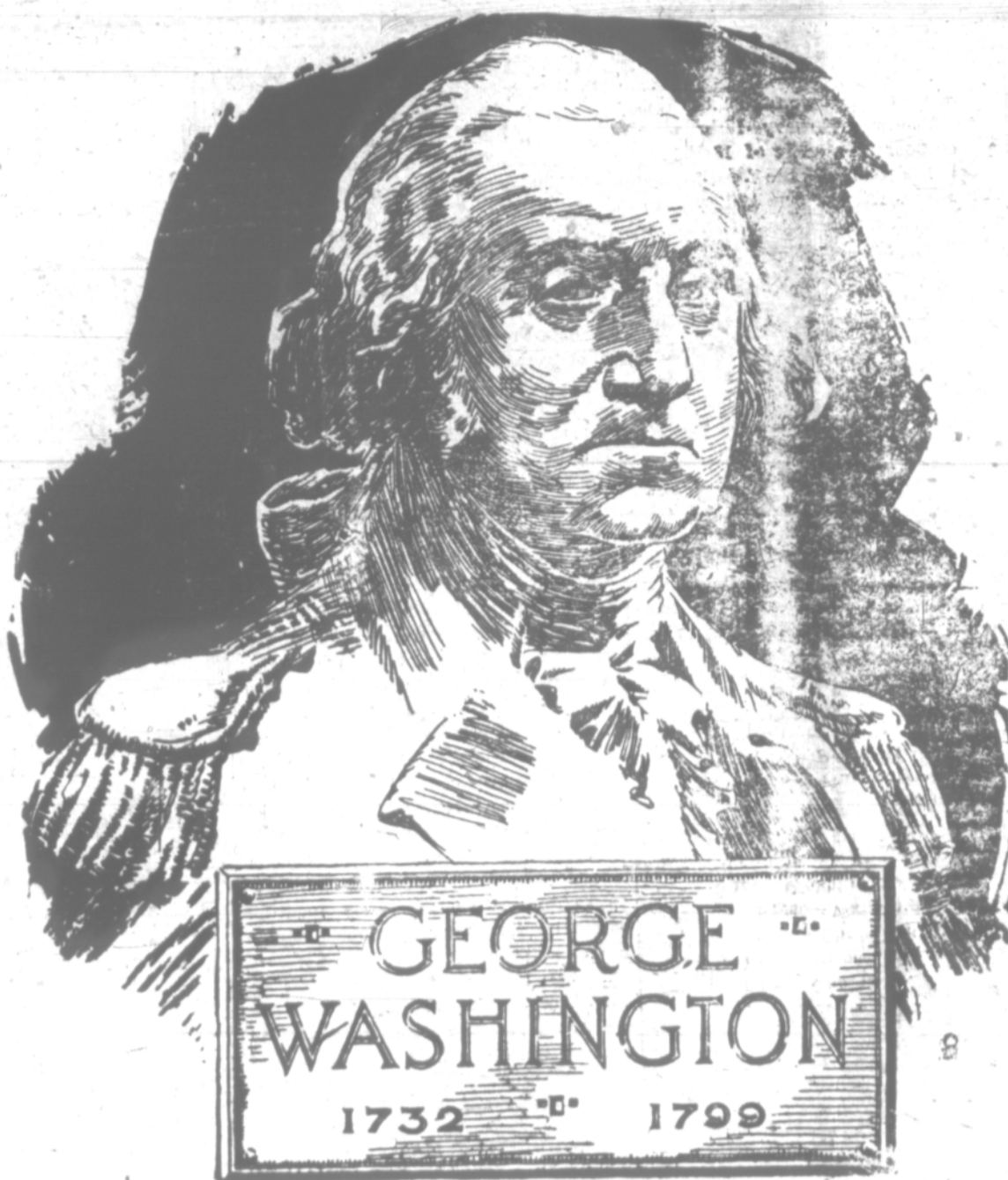

**PARKS IS NAMED ALASKA GOVERNOR**

Washington, D. C. — George Alexander Parks of Alaska was nominated by President Coolidge to be governor of Alaska.

Mr. Parks, who has been stationed in Alaska for several years, will succeed Scott C. Bone, whose term of governor will expire in several months.

The nomination came as a surprise, inasmuch as the term of Governor Bone does not expire until next June, and he had not submitted a formal resignation. The president recently reappointed Governor Farrington of Hawaii, and the belief was general that he intended to give Governor Bone another term of office.

The administration of Alaskan affairs by Governor Bone has been marked by several controversies, but whether these had a bearing on the president's decision was not made known at the White House.

**SEED WHEAT FUND READY**

Oregon Board Sets Machinery in Motion for Farmers.

Salem, Or.—The state board of control Saturday put into operation the machinery for loaning to the farmers of eastern Oregon \$1,500,000 for the purchase of seed, as authorized under an appropriation measure recently enacted by the legislature.

The appropriation was necessary, it was explained on the floor of the legislature, because of the recent cold weather which destroyed the crops of thousands of grain farmers residing east of the Cascade mountains. For the use of the money the borrowers will be compelled to pay interest at the rate of 6 per cent.

House Committee Kills Gooding Bill. Washington, D. C. — The Gooding long and short haul bill, over which Pacific coast and western intermountain interests have struggled for many months, was put to death in the house committee on interstate and foreign commerce. The vote was 11 to 6.

Kellogg Confirmed Secretary of State. Washington, D. C. — The nomination of Frank B. Kellogg of Minnesota to succeed Charles E. Hughes as secretary of state was confirmed by the senate.
