OREGON NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Important Occurrences of Past Week Briefly Compiled for Our Readers.

The harvest of gooseberries is over at Gaston and though the price received at the canneries was only 3 cents a pound as compared to 7 cents last year, the growers cleared almost as much, as the crop was much heavier.

The Oregon law, which provides for the search of automobiles, boats and other vehicles for contraband liquors, without a search warrant and without filing of an affidavit, is unconstitutional, it was held in an opinion given at Tillamook by George R. Bagley, circuit judge.

Oregon pensions have been granted as follows: John L. Herpelink, Postland, \$12 a month; Rose B. Wilson, Prineville, \$20; Arthur W. McConnell, Grants Pass, \$18; William J. Keating, Metford, \$12; Frances A. Harris, Oswego, \$30; Caloma Wilson, Rainier, \$30 a month.

The state board of higher curricula, which met to consider the controversy between the University of Oregon and Oregon Agricultural college over alleged duplication of courses, adjourned until July 11, without having arrived at a decision as to the merits of the various contentions.

R. E. Strahorn, president of the Oregon, California & Eastern, has announced the beginning of the revision of surveys of the Modoc Northern line preparatory to its possible construction at least as far as Malin, the center of the great Tule lake region, 27 miles southwest of Klamath Falls.

The largest sales of wheat land in Umatilla county for many years were made, the deals involving 2100 acres with a monetary consideration of about \$300,000. The land was in the vicinity of Athens, Adams and Spoford stations, in the heart of the county's highest producing wheat district. Both manufactures and sales of mills of the West Coast Lumbermen's association in the week ending May 30 were the lowest they had been in many weeks while shipments were above the average. Reports by 113 mills showed manufacture of 97,031,277 feet, sales of \$6,189,982 feet and shipments of 112,148,734 feet.

Rapid progress is being made with construction of the new line of the Southern Pacific company over the Gasondes between Oakridge and Klamath considering the difficulties encountered, according to Nelson F. MacTurt, supervisor of the Cascade National Forest. Rain, snow and mud have hampered the work to a great extent, he said.

The state engineer has issued an order authorizing the sale of one-half interest in the Wamsprings irrigation district reservoir and one-half of the surplus water to the United States reclamation service for use on the Vale project. The sale must be confirmed by the circuit court of Malheur county before it is binding on either party to the contract.

Estimates of the wheat crop in Umatilla county are that more milling wheat will be produced than ever before, due to the fact that so much of the soft club wheat was frozen out last winter and was reseeded with federation and hard federation. It has been estimated that hard federation will yield close to 1,000,000 bushels and that with present favorable conditions federation may yield 3,000,000 bushels.

The first step on the part of the state to recover possession of Sand Island, near the mouth of the Columbia river, was taken when the state land board leased whatever fishing rights it had in the property to the Columbia River Packers' association. The Barbery Packing company, with headquarters at Astoria, recently acquired a lease on the island from the federal government for a period of five years at an annual charge of \$45,000. It is predicted that the government will defend its claim to the island. This would throw the entire controversy into the courts and result in legal determination as to whether the state or the government is in control of the property.

The dead silence which pervades the place where the British and Russian governments are trying to reach a friendly agreement tends to confirm a general impression that it is much easier to quarrel with Russia than it is to effect a reconciliation.

No Regular Nail Sizes
Up until about the fifteenth century nails in England were sold by the hundred. Nails which sold for 10 cents a hundred were called 10-penny nails, those which sold for 8 cents, 8-penny nails, etc. When the prices changed the names persisted and, finally, came to be used to designate size, says the Detroit News.
The "d" is used as a sign of penny and is derived from the Latin "denarius." According to Webster's International dictionary, the explanation that "penny" in this connection is a corruption of "pound" is wrong. There are no regular standard sizes for nails by "pennies."
