Paul Nelson, 81, was killed by a premature explosion while blasting stumps on the McMinnville Meat company's new slaughter-house site, two miles north of McMinnville.

The recent hot wave did not materially affect the fruit crop of the Rogue river valley and the quality of the valley's greatest commercial crop, pears, promises to be the best in its history.

Total moneys paid growers of all kinds of fruit raised by members of the Hood River Apple Growers' association in 1924 reached \$3,201,886, far in excess of receipts of any former year.

The so-called Warren patent paying case was ended when Attorney-General Van Winkle and the state highway commission, representing the state, and attorneys for the Warren Construction company, reached a compromise agreement for the settlement of the case outside of court on the basis of a payment by the state of \$225,000 for royalty. The agreement closed a controversy of several years regarding the right of the construction company to royalties on the use by the state of its patent formula for bitulithic pavements.

Sealed bids on construction work in seven counties will be received by the state highway commission at the Multnomah county courthouse July 28. Among the projects are: Grading and surfacing 5.33 miles broken stone on Kings valley and Perkins market roads in Benton county; 23.2 miles of grading, graveling, 894,000 cubic yards of excavation on the Burnt Hill-Chetco river section of the Roosevelt coast highway in Curry county at an estimated cost of \$900,000. Eight and eight-tenths miles grading, involving approximately 225,000 cubic yards of excavation on the Siletz bay-Rocky creek section of the Roosevelt highway in Lincoln county; 12.66 miles of grading and surfacing of the Albany-Lebanon section of the Santiam highway in Linn county, and .65 miles of grading for the Meacham over-crossing section of the Old Oregon trail in Umatilla county.

Business Men Say: 'Advertising Pays'

Opened to traffic December 6, 1924, the Columbia interstate bridge at Hood River, built at a cost of approximately \$500,000 by the Oregon-Washington Bridge company, is paying the company having forwarded checks on a fractional year's dividend for 1925.

Will Moore, state insurance commissioner, was reappointed to the office for a term of four years by Governor Pierce. Mr. Moore's present term expires June 30. Mr. Moore also is state fire marshal and state real estate commissioner.

The annual scholarship of \$150, awarded to a student of advertising at the University of Oregon by the Portland Advertising club, was won this year by Frank Loggan of Burns and Wayne Leland of Salem. The prize was divided.

The government has finished piling on the north jetty on the Umpqua river. The distance covered is 1374 feet. R. W. Williams, resident engineer in charge of construction, estimates the rocking will be finished in another six months.

Oregon's 11 state institutions had a total population of 4877 on June 1 of this year, according to reports prepared by the superintendents for consideration of members of the state board of control. The total cost of conducting the institutions for the month of May was \$114,601.99.
