Growers affiliated with the Black
 Cherry association at Salem received
 11 cents a pound for their 1925 crop,
 according to announcement at head-
 quarters of the organization.

Bids for the construction of approxi-
 mately 30 miles of highway and three
 bridges will be considered at a meet-
 ing of the state highway commission to
 be held in Portland Thursday.

Members of the state irrigation sec-
 urities commission left Salem Tues-
 day by automobile for central Ore-
 gon where they will inspect a number
 of irrigation projects in that part of
 the state.

Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Collins and E. B.
 Schoenback, all of Portland, narrow-
 ly escaped death when they were pin-
 ned beneath their burning automobile
 following a collision with a truck
 near Canyonville.

The selection of a successor to P.
 L. Campbell, president of the Univer-
 sity of Oregon, who died in Eugene,
 probably will not be announced for
 several weeks, according to members
 of the board of regents.

Reports from Sweet Home give the
 information that Louis W. Hill plans
 to purchase from 12,000 to 15,000 acres
 of timber in that neighborhood. A
 pool is being made of the small hold-
 ings for the purpose of the sale.

Six wardens have been added to
 the force of the state game commis-
 sion, each to rove at will over the
 state with pack outfits and suppress
 violations of the game laws. It was
 announced by Game Warden Averill.

Alva R. Shumway of Milton, joint
 representative from Umatilla and Mor-
 row counties, has verified the report
 that he will be a candidate for the
 republican nomination for United
 States senator in the primaries next
 spring.

Lumber shipments by water from
 the Columbia river during the month
 of July totaled 123,856,315 feet or near-
 ly double those of July, 1924, accord-
 ing to figures compiled by the Col-
 umbia River Loggers' information
 bureau.

 Business Men Say: 'Advertising Pays'

Umatilla county was made defend-
 ant in a damage suit when the John-
 son Contract company of Portland fil-
 ed a complaint asking an accounting
 between the county and the contract-
 ing company for work performed in
 1922 and 1923 on the Pine creek road.

Stanfield sheep interests will prob-
 ably move their headquarters to Baker
 this fall, according to a statement of
 Hugh Stanfield, brother of the sena-
 tor. The Stanfield headquarters have
 been at Welser for the past four years,
 having been moved there from Onta-
 rio.

There were two fatalities in Ore-
 gon due to industrial accidents in the
 week ending August 13, according to
 a statement issued by the Industrial
 accident commission. The victims
 were Wilbur Pegrum of Astoria and
 Robert Casey of Vancouver, B. C. A
 total of 938 accidents was reported.

Additional trail crews numbering 21
 men have been ordered by C. C. Hall,
 forest supervisor, to report to the
 Fish lake control station for work on
 trails to be completed this year and
 for which appropriations have already
 been made.

As an experiment with vegetables,
 the Hunt Brothers cannery in Albany
 is making a run of 150 tons of string
 beans. Following the bean canning
 60 tons of beets will be processed. If
 the experiment is successful it is plan-
 ned to make the cannery a permanent
 vegetable canning plant.
