Clean Grain Seed Means Clean Fields

Copper carbonate dust for control of wheat smut continues to prove its worth in Oregon, and will be used largely again this year.

Only good grade copper carbonate should be used. Some inferior brands are on the market, having low copper content.

If the dust is as fine as it should be and is put on rightly two ounces per bushel is enough.

The treating chamber should not be too full to permit wide movement of the grain as the machine is rotated.

In seeding the dusted grain the rate is cut down because the grain does not swell as in liquid treatment and neither is the germination injured.
