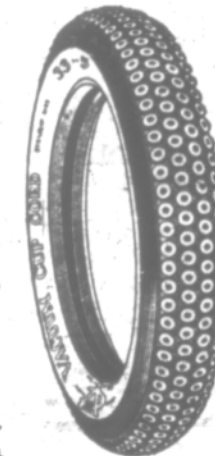

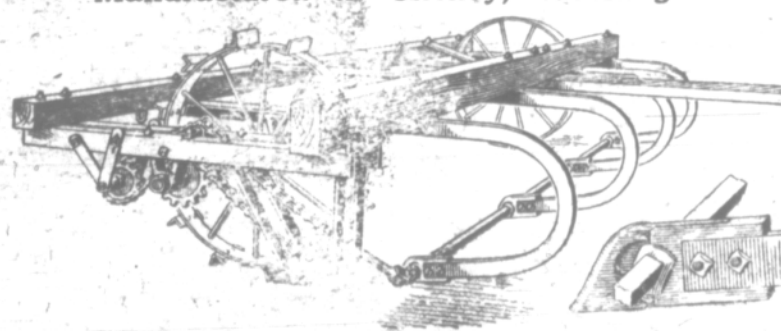

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:
That a special election will be held in
the City of Moro, Sherman County,
Oregon, on the 14th day of Septem-
ber, 1925, to determine whether or
not the charter amendment adopted,
proposed and submitted to the voters
of said city by the Common Council
shall be enacted by the city. The
ballot title of said proposed charter
amendment, and the form and num-
ber in which the question will be
printed on the official ballot, being as
follows:

CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMIT- TED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COMMON COUNCIL.

AN ACT

To amend the Charter of the City
of Moro, entitled: An act to incor-
porate the City of Moro, in Sherman
County, State of Oregon, being an
act of the Legislative Assembly of
the State of Oregon, approved the
17th day of February, 1899, as amended
by an act proposed by the Com-
mon Council of the City of Moro,
Sherman County, Oregon, and enti-
tled: "An ordinance to amend subdi-
vision 59 of Section 39 of the act of
the Legislative Assembly of the State
of Oregon, entitled: 'An act to incor-
porate the City of Moro, in Sherman
County, State of Oregon, approved
February 17, 1899,' so as to author-
ize the Council of said City of Moro
to borrow money in a sum not ex-
ceeding ten thousand (\$10,000.00)
dollars to satisfy bonds heretofore
issued for the purpose of acquiring
and maintaining water works and
electric light works, or either of such
works, and to issue bonds therefor,"
and passed by the vote of the people
of the City of Moro on February 20,
1920, And to amend all other acts
providing a charter for said city,
and amending the same by adding
thereto Chapter XIII providing for
the purchase by the City of Moro of
the Moro Hotel Company property in
the City of Moro, Sherman County,
State of Oregon, for the sum of
\$31500 for auditorium and general
city purposes, and for procuring
funds by a bond issue in the sum of
\$31,500 for the payment of the same.

An act proposed by the Common
Council of the City of Moro, Sher-
man County, Oregon, to enact an
amendment to the Charter of said
City of Moro and to be submitted to
the legal voters of said City for their
approval or rejection, at a special
election to be held in said City on the
14th day of September, 1925, and to
repeal all acts, and parts of acts, in
conflict therewith. Proposed and
adopted by the Common Council of
said City and filed in the office of the
City Recorder on the 11th day of
August, 1925, in accordance with the
provisions of Chapter 226 of the
General Laws of the State of Oregon
for 1907 and the amendments
thereto.

"AN ACT"

To amend an act entitled: "An
act to incorporate the City of Moro,
in Sherman County, State of Oregon,
being an act of the Legislative As-
sembly of the State of Oregon, ap-
proved the 17th day of February,
1899, and as amended by an act pro-
posed by the Common Council of the
City of Moro, Sherman County, Ore-
gon, approved February 17, 1899," so
as to authorize the Council of said
City of Moro to borrow money in a
sum not exceeding ten thousand
(\$10,000.00) dollars, to satisfy bonds
heretofore issued for the purpose of
acquiring and maintaining water
works and electric light works, or
either such works, and to issue bonds
therefor," and passed by the vote of
the people of the City of Moro, Feb-
ruary 20th, 1920, and all other acts
providing a charter for said city,
theretofore and thereafter enacted by
Legislative Assembly or by vote of
the people.

The City of Moro does ordain as
follows:

That an act entitled: An act to
incorporate the City of Moro, Sher-
man County, Oregon, being an Act
of the Legislative Assembly of the
State of Oregon, approved the 17th
day of February, 1899, and as am-
ended by an act proposed by the
Common Council of the City of Moro,
Sherman County, State of Oregon,
approved the 17th day of February,
1899, so as to authorize said city of
Moro to borrow money in a sum not
exceeding ten thousand (\$10,000)
dollars to satisfy bonds heretofore
issued for the purpose of acquiring
and maintaining water works and
electric light works, or either of
such works, and to issue bonds there-
for," and passed by the vote of the
people of the City of Moro, Sherman
County, Oregon, on the 20th day of
February, 1920, and all other acts
providing a charter for said City,
theretofore and thereafter enacted by
Legislative Assembly, or by the vote
of the people, be, and the same here-

by is amended by adding thereto
Chapter XIII to read as follows:

CHAPTER XIII.

Section 1. The common council
of the City of Moro, Sherman Coun-
ty, State of Oregon, is hereby autho-
rized and empowered, for the pur-
pose of providing the citizens and in-
habitants of said city with a building
for public purposes to be used as a
public auditorium, community house
or building suitable and convenient
to be used as a civic center for the
convenience and general welfare of
its citizens, to purchase from the
Moro Hotel Company, a corporation,
that certain building, known as the
Moro Hotel, together with the fur-
niture and fixtures contained therein,
together with Lots Four (4) and
Five (5) of Block Six (6) of the origi-
nal City of Moro, Sherman County,
Oregon, upon which the same is sit-
uate, for the sum of \$31,500, and for
the purpose of procuring funds with
which to purchase the same, together
with all the right, title and interest
of said Moro Hotel Company, a cor-
poration, in and to said property for
any or all of the aforesaid purposes,
the common council of the City of
Moro is hereby authorized and em-
powered to issue and dispose of gen-
eral obligation bonds of said city in
the sum of \$31,500, said bonds to be
in denominations of \$500.00 and
\$1000.00 each, duly signed by the
Mayor and countersigned by the Re-
corder, under the corporate seal of
the City, bearing semi-annual inter-
est coupons attached thereto, bear-
ing facsimile engraved signatures
of the Mayor and Recorder, whereby
the city shall be held, in substance
and effect, to undertake and promise
to pay the bearers of each of said
bonds at maturity thereof the sum

therein named in Gold Coin of the
United States of the present standard
of value, with interest thereon in like
Gold Coin at the rate of 6 per cent,
payable semi-annually, each of said
bonds to be a direct general obliga-
tion of the said City of Moro, and to
be known as the City of Moro Au-
ditorium Bonds. Said bonds shall be
dated at a convenient time, to be
fixed by the council, the maturity,
or maturities, to be likewise fixed
by the Council but not to exceed
twenty (20) years from the date,
and the principal and interest of
said bonds shall be payable at the
fiscal agency of the State of Oregon
in New York City.

Section 2.

The debt limit con-
tained in the charter of said city
shall not apply to the bonds hereby
authorized.

Section 3.

The council shall, each
year, at the time of making the an-
nual tax levy for city purposes, in-
clude in such levy a sum sufficient to
pay interest due on the outstanding
bonds of this issue and to retire the
principal thereof at maturity.
