With election of officers for the new year and the unanimous indorsement of a resolution opposing construction of the Skyline trail along the Cascade range in Oregon as a menace to health through the contamination of the water supply, the 51st annual convention of the Oregon State Medical society came to an end at Medford.

More gasoline was sold in Oregon during July, 1925, than in any other similar period since the motor vehicle fuels tax law became effective, according to a report prepared by the secretary of state. The July distribution of gasoline aggregated 11,377,703 gallons. Taxes received by the state as a result of the July sales aggregated \$346,694.40.
