OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Brief Resume of Happenings of the Week Collected for Our Readers.

Four new business enterprises have located in Monmouth within the last year.
Graham was chosen for the annual convention of the Oregon W. C. T. U. next year.
There were 99 fires in Portland in September, 31 of which entailed losses of \$33,706.24.
Paul Vogt of Portland, was instantly killed near Redding, Cal., when he was caught in the belting of a rock crusher.

For the first time in October in many years the city of Portland is using all of the water in the Bull Run river.
E. E. Myers, mayor of Warrenton has tendered his resignation to the city council on grounds of "indefinite absence from the city."

The fifth annual Milton-Freewater Apple show was held last week with the largest display of apples ever assembled in eastern Oregon.
M. P. Lee, rural mail carrier working out of Canby, probably lost the sight of one eye when attacked by a large hawk which he shot.

James Romig, 27, of Baker, was instantly killed when struck by an auto mobile driven by C. H. Getchell on the Old Oregon trail near Hotlake.
The Young People's Luther league convention of the Oregon and southern Washington districts will be held in Silverton November 5 to 7, inclusive.

Albany street lighting system is due for a change as the result of a movement started by a citizens' committee to have individual lamps on curb posts.
The Salem Ad club has appointed a vigilance committee to wage war on a number of shoplifters who have been active in Salem during the past few months.

One hundred members of Methodist Ladies' Aid societies from Union county met at Union in a first annual conference. Cove was chosen for next year's meeting.
Members of the Eugene Elks' lodge visited schools throughout Lane county in the interests of the fund for the restoration of the historic warship "Old Ironsides."

Members of the Longfellow clubs at Medford, Marshfield, Portland, Corvallis, Eugene and McMinnville were guests of the Salem branch of the organization at a banquet.
County assessors from all sections of the state have been summoned to meet in Salem on Monday, November 2, according to announcement made by Earl Fisher, state tax commissioner. Discussion of county tax ratios will play an important part in the program.

In tribute to Thomas A. McCann, executive manager of the Shevlin lumber interests in the United States, the Shevlin-Hixon company plant in Bend closed for a half day Saturday. Mr. McCann was first general manager of the Bend plant. He died in Arizona last week.
A deer from the wilds southeast of Bandon created an amount of excitement there recently, when it strolled and ran through the streets, with half a hundred excited men after it. The animal had several narrow escapes from being captured, but always eluded its pursuers.

More than 150 men, representing practically all sections of the United States, have replied to an advertisement inserted in a Salem newspaper by a mysterious Miss Jordan, in which she offered to pay \$400 to any respectable man who would marry her so that she might inherit an estate.
Attempts are being made in the Tumalo reservoir basin to float boxes of dynamite, with time fuses attached, into a subterranean channel. If the attempts finally meet with success, it is believed that the exploding dynamite will block the underground passage which has made the reservoir useless.

Hearings to determine the reasonableness of the tariffs of several stage lines operating in this state was started in the offices of the public service commission at Salem. Stage lines represented at the hearing included the Coast Auto line, Portland-Newberg, McMinnville Stage line and the Interurban Stage company.

OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Principal Events of the Week Briefly Sketched for Information of Our Readers.

I. L. Patterson, resident of Eola, Polk county, has announced himself as a candidate for the republican nomination for governor. This is the first entry for the gubernatorial primary.

The Medford water commission has appointed F. C. Dillard, well known Pacific coast water engineer, to be in charge of the construction of Medford's new \$975,000 water works system.

Mountain range in eastern Oregon is enough better than it was last year that sheepmen expect to have the use of the higher ranges for between a month and six weeks longer than in 1924.

The city of Astoria won in the supreme court its mandamus proceeding against Clatsop county to compel the county court to levy a road tax, a part of which would be available for use by the city.

The assessed valuation of property in Umatilla county for 1925, not including public utilities, is a little more than half a million dollars less than in 1924, according to R. O. Hawke, county assessor.

Three fires are burning in the Mount Hebo district of the Siuslaw national forest in Tillamook county and one is burning in the Waldport district, according to Ralph S. Shaley, supervisor.

The Washington County Fruit Growers association recently was organized with George Woolworth as head and G. C. Chase as secretary. The association is in the form of a producers' co-operative exchange.

The run of salmon in the Columbia river is very light due to the continued dry weather, which leaves the river low and clear. There will be few fish, according to fishermen, until there is a good rainfall.

Finger prints on two pieces of cheese was the only trace left by thieves who looted the cheese factory at Beaver, taking 1450 pounds of cheese and 40 pounds of butter, the loss being estimated at \$440.

One hundred and three mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending October 17 manufactured 101,233,741 feet of lumber, sold 95,848,354 feet and shipped 101,453,221 feet. New business was 5 per cent below production. Shipments were 6 per cent above new business.

Umatilla county wheat farmers are wanting rain in appreciable quantities for the benefit of the newly-seeded crop, and in some districts the drought that has prevailed practically all fall may make necessary some re-seeding of fields. Only a small percentage of the crop is up yet, although more than half of the acreage has been seeded.

Tom Murray, convict, under death sentence for the murder of John Sweeney, guard, during a break at the Oregon state penitentiary on August 12, testified in the circuit court at Salem that neither James Wilcox nor Ellsworth Kelley, co-defendants in the crime, had any direct connection with the death of the slain guard.

The engineering corps of the United States army has decided to extend the jetty at the mouth of the Umpqua river, in Oregon, so that the flow of water in that stream will scour away the sand bar impeding navigation at that point. An allotment of \$54,000 for this project was authorized from existing river and harbor improvement funds.

Two forest fires reported in the south Umpqua district, between the Umpqua river and Jackson creek, above Tillar, resulted in lookouts being ordered to posts at Red Butte and Devil's Knob. The fires are out of control but as yet are doing little damage. Owing to the lack of rain, the forests are very dry and the fire hazard is increasing.

E. F. Averill, state game warden, and Commissioner Bauer of Corvallis, who have just returned from eastern Oregon, expect to make a tentative recommendation against the proposed game refuge in southeastern Umatilla county, according to Mr. Averill. Deep, it was said, are on the increase in the community where the proposed refuge would be maintained and the winter range is limited. An increase in the number of deer, it is felt, would seriously impoverish the available range, and it is recommended that another survey be made later in the year.
