OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Brief Resume of Happenings of the Week Collected for Our Readers.
Klamath Falls now has a population of nearly 10,000 it is estimated.
Plans for the organization of a civic league are under way at Silverton.
An increase of 495 children of school age in Eugene was found by the school census enumerators this year.
The population of the county fell at Salem has dropped to 17, the smallest number of prisoners in more than a year.
Jefferson county schools were closed two days last week to permit teachers to attend the institute held at Madras.
The board of trustees of Linfield college at McMinnville has decided to raise \$500,000 for new buildings and equipment.
The bed of lower Klamath lake yielded 46 bushels of rye to an acre this year on a 778 acre tract, according to M. Metzchenbacher.
Bernad Christianson, 79, an inmate of the Lutheran home for the aged near Eugene, sustained a broken neck when he fell off a barn.
The city council of Bend has installed W. U. Foster of that city as city recorder to fill the vacancy caused by the death of James Mast.
The McKenzie pass highway over the summit of the Cascades was opened to traffic again after having been closed two days on account of deep snow.
Establishment of a branch of the West Coast Tanning company in Salem will be considered at the next meeting of the local chamber of commerce.

The Arlington city council has approved the city budget for 1926, in the amount of \$28,145, as against \$27,445 for the year 1925, a reduction of \$700.
Tranchell & Parelius of Portland were awarded the contract for the general construction work of the state normal school at Ashland. Their bid was \$199,572.
That he would be a candidate for governor on the republican ticket at the coming primaries was the announcement made at Bend by Jay H. Upton, state senator.
A total of 851 persons were arrested for violations of the state prohibition laws during October, according to a report prepared by William S. Larsen, state prohibition director.
When Mr. and Mrs. Newton Smith drove up to their home in Salem Friday night they discovered a large white bear roasting on the front bumper of their machine. The bear was asleep.
Five losses in Oregon, exclusive of Portland, during the month of October aggregated \$184,706.34, according to a report prepared by the state fire marshal. There were a total of 46 fires.
Ray Jilson, 34, a Southern Pacific ticket agent at Ashland, shot Mrs. Fred Nell, 38, and then, turning the pistol upon himself, committed suicide, at the Nell residence, where Jilson lodged.
Whether the teachers employed in the Salem schools will receive salary increases aggregating approximately \$30,000 annually, will be decided by the voters at a special election to be held December 2.
One hundred and four mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending November 7, manufactured 100,860,415 feet of lumber, and \$1,062,431 feet and shipped 94,694,647 feet.
The annual conference of editors and business managers of the Pacific Intercollegiate Press association convened at Eugene with 24 delegates, representing every collegiate news paper on the coast, in attendance.
A high wind, bordering on a tornado, caused damage in the rural districts lying between Independence, Polk county and Liberty, Marion county, aggregating approximately \$2000. The storm followed a path 150 feet wide.
A report favoring the deepening of the Columbia river channel between the Tongue Point naval base and the mouth of the stream has been made to Major-General Harry Taylor, chief of engineers, United States army, by Major R. T. Cotner, district officer at Portland.

DEFAULTS ON BONDS STIRS LEGISLATORS
Olympia, Wash. — With Governor Hartley and an apparent majority of the state legislature fully aroused to the credit crisis caused by the default of Washington cities of their local improvement district obligations, corrective legislation already seems assured at this session. This is one of the very few highly important matters covered in the governor's message that admits of no controversy as to purpose, though there will be some conflict of opinion as to the means of correction.
So far the discussion revolves around the point of whether it will be possible in any way to compel the defaulting communities to clean up their outstanding improvement district debts. No one doubts the feasibility and practical necessity of making it impossible for improvement district securities to be issued in the future without guaranty of payment through a general tax levy. But in all apparent good faith, many legislators are doubtful if any law can now be enacted that would force an unwilling city or town to raise money for the redemption of the large amount of district improvement bonds that have been permitted, under cover of existing law and the supreme court's decision, to become worthless.

BRIEF GENERAL NEWS
The Italian newspapers raised a chorus of rejoicing over the settlement of the war debt to the United States.
A. W. Ewert, former treasurer of the South Dakota rural credit board, was indicted on charges of embezzling \$211,437.50 of rural credit funds.
Sixty dead on the floor of the ocean is the story of the British submarine M-1, which submerged in the English channel and did not come back to the surface.
Greece has officially informed the league of nations that she would welcome a Balkan security and compulsory arbitration pact along the lines of the pact for western Europe negotiated at Locarno.
Sharp slashes of from 25 to 50 per cent in inheritance taxes on estates valued at more than \$100,000 will be incorporated in the new revenue bill, Representative William Green of Iowa, chairman of the house ways and means committee, announced.
Coolidge Will Not Reappoint Hanes. Washington, D. C.—President Coolidge will not reappoint Commissioner Hanes to the shipping board, but he is anxious to replace the Portland Democrat with a man from the Pacific northwest. Senators McNary of Oregon and Jones of Washington brought that impression away from the White House with them.
