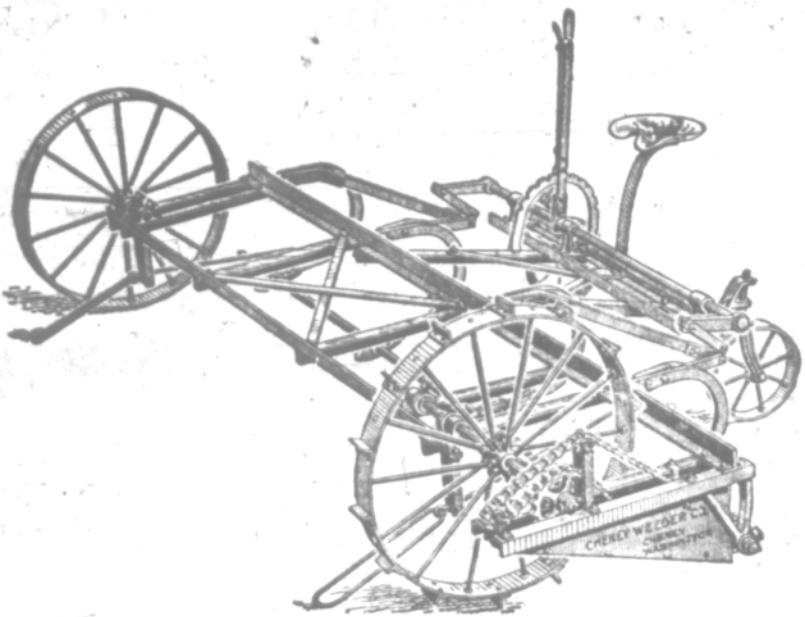

Big Chinese Novelty Dance

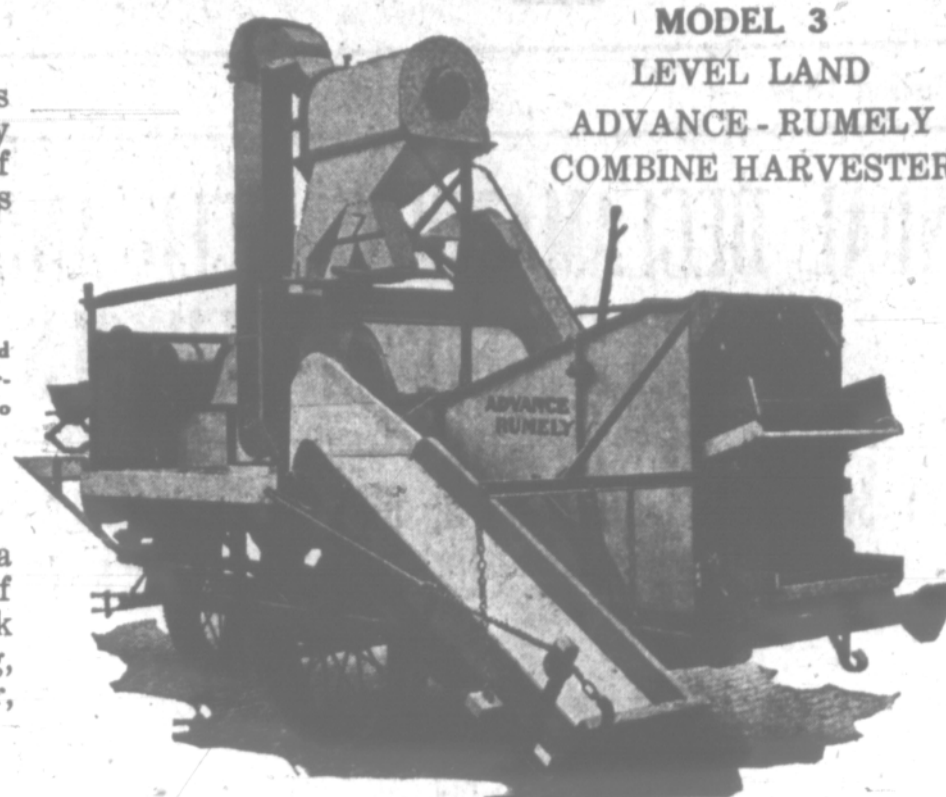

Prominent among the new changes will be a completely revised listing of premium offerings in the women's division. Many items in the old book were out-of-date. These have been entirely eliminated and new items added. This was done by a committee of women, assisted by a suggested list supplied by the extension service department of the Oregon State College.

Many changes have also been made in the horse, cattle and sheep classifications. A number of items have been dropped entirely, mostly those that have never been exhibited at the Sherman County Fair.
