Sound Your Horn

That an automobile driver who fails to sound his horn in passing another car is negligent and liable for any accident that may be caused by his act, is a recent decision by the Supreme Court of the state of Washington and one of great importance to motorists all over the country, according to a report of the Legal Department of the Oregon State Motor Association.

Although this particular question has not been decided in Oregon, the sound prediction is that the Oregon courts would take the same position. It is pointed out that the Oregon law reads, "The driver of an overtaking motor vehicle not within a business or residence district shall give audible warning with his horn or other warning device before passing or attempting to pass a vehicle proceeding in the same direction." Under this law the court would undoubtedly follow the precedent of the Washington case which was decided in the absence of a state regulation for giving a signal on passing another vehicle.

In the Washington case the driver upon whom the liability was placed for the accident had just started to pass the car ahead when it turned to the center of the road.

Attention is also called to the highway regulation in Oregon to the effect that it is the duty of the driver of an overtaken vehicle to give way when the signal is given.
