**"DOMESTIC TROUBLES"**  
Wives who can't tell their twin-brother husbands apart! That is the unusual plight of Betty Blythe and Jean Laverty in "Domestic Troubles," the Warner Bros. screen comedy featuring Clyde Cook and Louise Fazenda, coming to Moro Theater next Saturday night.  
"Domestic Troubles" is a tangled tale of twin brothers, played by the inimitable little jackanapes of the screen, Clyde Cook. He is Horace the nifty brother and again James, the docile. Each has a wife. Horace is married to Carrie, a strong-minded feminist. James is partner to Grace, a butterfly, who has a young sheik on the side.

#### Farmers Given Party

More than 200 farmers in 40 automobiles took advantage of the invitation of D. E. Stephens, superintendent of Moro Experiment Station, to inspect the work of the station on the occasion of Annual Field Day held Monday afternoon.  
The visitors were shown plots of field peas that had grown this crop to advantage for 15 years; also numerous other plots demonstrating rotation of crops, various methods of cultivation, the results of poor farming as well as the results of methodical practical farm work.  
They were shown many different varieties of oats, barley and wheat and the methods explained whereby new varieties were obtained at the cost of tedious painstaking labor and the careful compilation of records from a long number of years work.  
The new wheat varieties obtained by crossing federation wheat with forty-fold and similar wheats were shown the visitors from the southern part of the county and met with their enthusiastic approval. The number of farmers applying for small parcels of seed wheat of the new varieties soon exceeded the available supply that the station had on hand. Seed wheat was promised to a large number, but with the reservation that if the new wheat varieties were not commercially worthwhile that the growing of the new wheat would be stopped by those who were given seed for trial on their farms.

#### Editor On Vacation

For the first time in 14 years the editor of the Sherman County Observer will take a weeks vacation, beginning this Friday morning when Editor and Mrs. C. L. Ireland will leave Moro by auto for Klamath Falls, Crater lake, the Oregon Caves west of Roseburg, and home by way of either McKenzie pass highway or Portland.

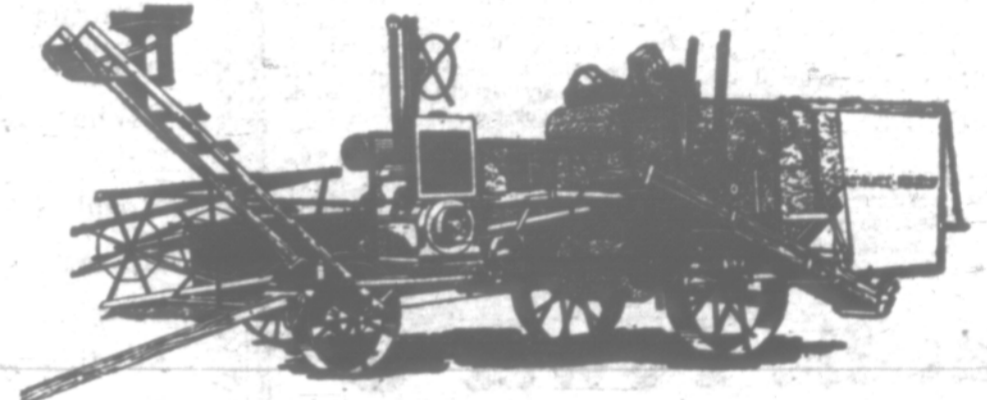

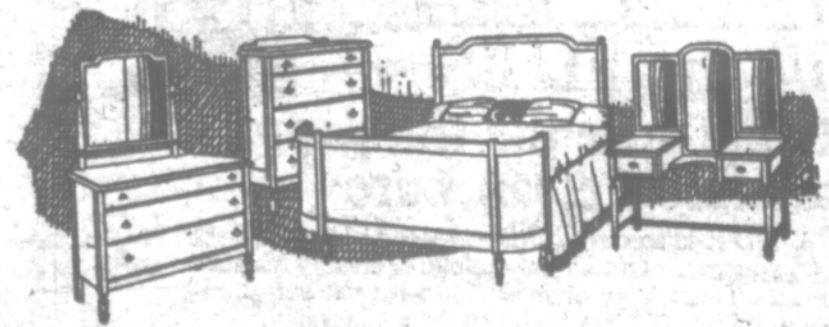
