EASTER DAY FILLS CHURCH

LARGE NUMBERS ATTEND SPECIAL SERVICE AT MORO CHURCHES

Forty-two members of the Knights Templar lodge of Masons made their annual pilgrimage last Easter Sunday by coming to Moro where an afternoon service was held in the First Presbyterian church, followed by lunch served the visiting brethren in the church basement dining room. Members of the order attended the service from all parts of Sherman county, The Dalles, Hood River, Goldendale and Dufur. The address was made by Rev. Hawks of Wasco.

At the eleven o'clock hour, the house was filled with an attentive audience who followed the pastor closely as he developed his theme—"The Doctrine of Hope." Again in the evening, the house was filled with interested worshippers for the crowning service of the day, when the choir, assisted by Mrs. Dorothy Foss and Miss Emma Stevens presented "Love Triumphant" taken from "Tor, the Street Boy of Jerusalem." It was a very impressive service, as rendered. Part of the story would be read, then the truth would be driven home by an appropriate selection by the choir. The solo parts were taken by Miss Turley Mr. Williams and Mr. Akers. Mr. and Mrs. Harry Pinkerton sang a duet, "He Did Not Die in Vain," which was very beautiful. Problems For Printers

Publishing Business Affected By Government Competition.

(National Editorial Assn.)
"Never before in the history of American politics have the people been brought face to face with a problem for which the newspaper publishers and printers have sought recognition for nearly forty years. The press of the country has from time to time called on Congress to recognize the principle that the government has no right to compete unfairly with private enterprise in the printing of special request addresses on stamped envelopes.

The printers and publishers want the government to stop selling a commodity - commercial printing - which is available in the local print shops without placing orders with the government post office.

"Equality of opportunity is all that the press is asking for in the enactment of legislation - that is we believe we should have equal opportunity of competing for the printing of envelopes in each community. We resent propaganda of government bureaucrats in the post office department circulated among citizens patronizing this government agency selling printing. This paternalistic propaganda deliberately misrepresents the printers of the country and terms them 'profiteers' because they cannot compete with government prices.

"It should be borne in mind that in instances where citizens of this community patronize the government and place their orders for printing with the post office department they are encouraging government competition, which a majority of American voters have unreservedly condemned. The principle of unfair government competition with private enterprise is not an abstract proposition, but a real problem which is brought to your own door if you continue to buy printing from the federal government or fail to protest the restriction of this bureaucratic practice.
