Home Pointers

(From School of Home Economics) If freely used in the preparation of foods, milk adds greatly to the food value of meals.

Cream is butter fat containing largely vitamin A. Whole milk is cream plus protein, milk sugar, minerals and vitamin B.

Mineral constituents of milk that are especially important to the body are lime, phosphorus and iron.

Milk contains the kind of protein needed to build or repair muscles and tissues of the body.

Milk soups are an excellent way not only of serving milk but of utilizing left over portions of vegetables and other foods, such as tomatoes, peas, beans, carrots or onions.

A dish is richer if whole rather than skim milk is used, but skim milk contains not only the protein but practically all the other nutrients of whole milk except the fat and vitamin A.

A good home-made furniture polish can be prepared by mixing one part of raw linseed oil with two parts of turpentine. A little melted beeswax can be added if desired.

In a recipe which calls for only one or two eggs, the eggs serve largely to bind the ingredients, and it makes little difference whether the whites and yolks are separated or not.

Time can often be saved when a cake is to be made by taking the shortening out of the refrigerator several hours before time to use it. It will be easier both to measure and to cream.

Bright colored clothing helps to protect children by making them more easily seen by the motorist. Such colors as yellow, rose, orange and red provide a safety zone around the child, while others such as dark blue brown and tan do not attract attention.

There are many ways of adding just a slight touch of color to the food to make it more attractive. Among the materials that can be used for this purpose are pimiento, green peppers, paprika, pickles, olives, radishes, cherries, candied fruit, and candied fruit peel.

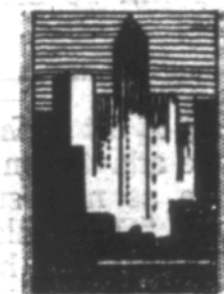
