Some people know the value of even so small an item as a cent, and practice economy in every possible way to save that cent. Such a practice is commendable. Such persons are the ones who make the wealth of the country.

Put it upon a solid basis and attract business from the outside world. But there is such a thing as false economy, and matters look as though the economy practiced just now by some Sherman county farmers is not of the saving, business-like kind that actually puts the cent into the pocket of the farmer who deserves it. That a railroad is a benefit to a community is no uncertain fact, and that the Columbia is going to be—or better yet, is a great benefit to Sherman county, cannot be disputed. It ought to be patronized, yet there is wheat going on to Rufus every day. Have those farmers figured on the situation that they know what they are doing? It does not seem so. The mere fact that they have the wagons, horses, and time does not stand argument.

The hard part of the trip is between Wasco and the river. It is there that wagons are shaken to pieces; that the blacksmith bills—and large ones—are incurred; that horses are crippled and broken down before their time. It is the trip down the canyon that causes horses to be shed; an outlay of several dollars on big teams—and all of them are big. Again, the gain in cash is more than offset by the personal discomfort experienced by the man who puts in four nights in the week sleeping out of doors and under all sorts of conditions, who must needs prepare his own food; and more than all, absent himself from his family. Nor is this all. It is getting time to prepare for another crop; winter wheat ought to be sown, fall plowing ought to be done; seeding ought to be repaired and got ten in shape to get through winter, and the average man who neglects these things to get the difference in the price of wheat in the two places will pay more than double the amount in the end. It is not a problem of patronizing the railroad because it is here and needs your patronage, but it is a matter of patronizing it because it saves the farmer money.

No town that expects to prosper and grow can do so until its business men organize themselves into a body of some sort—the object of which is the good of the locality of the organization. Wasco needs something of that sort. There is a building going up that could be turned into neat club-room; and a commercial club can be organized that will take hold of public matters and advertise Wasco and Sherman county. New business ought to be attracted, and an organization of this sort could correspond with business men in a systematic manner that will give us a better standing among men who are looking for business locations. Let some one take hold of this matter and get a good live club organized in the very near future.
