The Epworth League's Meet.
The fourth annual convention of the Epworth League of The Dalles District Columbia River Conference, convened in Goldendale, Wash., May 20, and 21, of which the following is a complete report.

FIRST DAY.
The 8:30 devotional service was conducted by E. Wishard of Arlington. Owing to the absence of the president, A. W. Schwartz, G. M. Smith, the late vice president, took the chair. Some time was taken up in organization and business session at which time a very lengthy report of the district president was read by the secretary, in which he regretted very much that he could not be with us, and gave an account of his trip to a wife and also taken a tract of land which the convention deemed was a good use being it was scriptural. At 10 a. m. a very instructive paper, "The League—Its Possibilities and Dangers," was read by Prof. H. H. Goldendale which was discussed by the convention.

Mr. W. S. Clipp of Arlington then read a paper "The Epworth as a Model of Christianity," which was very helpful to the league.

1:15. Devotional services, conducted by Miss Nettie Fredrick, of The Dalles. The subject of "The Junior League, Its Place in the Work," was presented by Miss Ethel Masters, of Goldendale and discussed by the convention.

The subject of "Advancing the Epworth League Reading Course," was presented by Miss Mattie Barnes, of Antelope, in which she urged all members to take this reading course. Short addresses were then presented by Rev. Smith of Prineville and Rev. Johns of Fossil.

Evening session. The devotional services were conducted by Miss Mabel Riddell and Edwin Hill of The Dalles. Then all listened to a very able sermon by Rev. C. D. Nickless of Moro, after which all members and ministers were invited to Mr. Flannery for reception by the members of the Goldendale League for the purpose of getting the delegates acquainted.

SECOND DAY.
Devotional services were conducted by W. S. Clipp of Arlington. Then followed the report of the chapters, in which the work of the district was found to be good; especially that of the Antelope League, which is one of the youngest leagues in the district.

The district officers then all gave good reports, except the second vice-president, who was not present.

The paper, "The Ideal Devotional Meeting, and How It Should be Conducted," written by Miss Martha Wheelodon and read by Miss Nettie Fredrick of The Dalles, was a very good one and needed no comments.

"School for Young People," was presented by G. M. Smith of Kiano, which contained many helpful thoughts.

The 1:15 devotional services, conducted by Wm. Peddicord, were well attended.

The paper, "The Tithing System in Finance," was read by Mrs. N. Evans of Goldendale, after which Rev. Hornbrook of Goldendale made a short but very instructive talk.

Clyde Riddell of The Dalles then presented the subject of "The League a Patriot," which was good and instructive to every one who heard it.

The election of officers then took place, and resulted as follows:

Dr. Belknap, Prairie City; Sec. Mrs. Mabel Riddell, The Dalles; Cor. Sec. Miss Veda Dunlap, Wasco; Ex. Com. Rev. Warner, John Parrot, and C. D. Nickless.

7:30. Devotional services conducted by G. M. Smith of Kiano.

After this the president installed officers took place, to which Rev. Evans gave the response.

THIRD DAY.
Sunday, 22. The Sunrise Prayer-meeting, led by Mr. Clipp, was well attended, as was also the love feast at 10 A. M., after which Rev. Johns of Fossil delivered a very able sermon; then followed the Sunday school.

At 3:30 the Junior League, conducted by Mr. Clipp, was well attended, especially by the children.

At 5:30, Epworth League, conducted by Miss Beck, of The Dalles and Miss Barnes, of Antelope, was one of the best meetings of the convention.

This was followed by an able sermon by Rev. Nickless. This being the closing service of the convention, a consecration service was held and a general handshake, all regretting to leave, as the Goldendale people had been so kind to each and all. Adjourned to meet next year in Moro.
