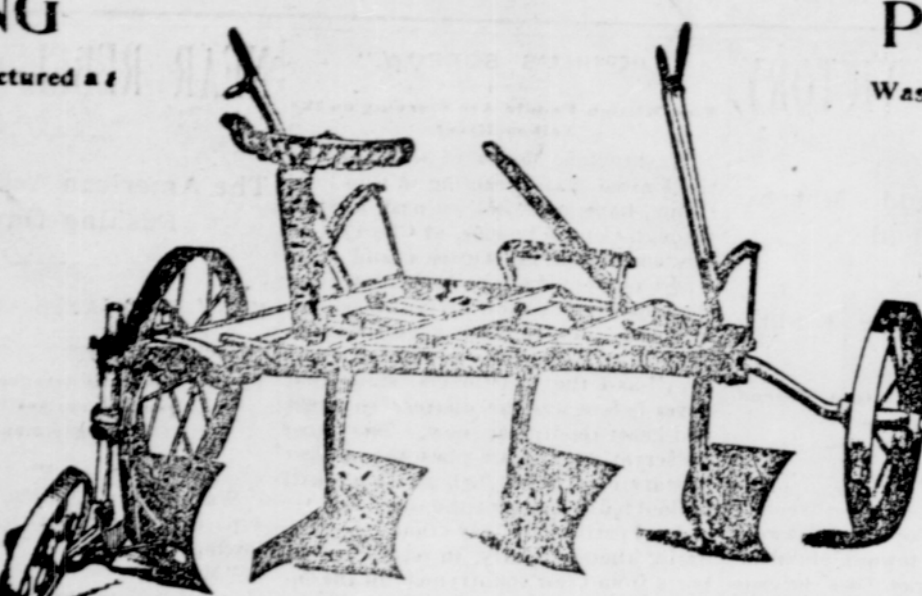

Prominent men say Quay will fail to be elected. This, if true, will leave four vacancies, three republican and one democrat; and that should the governors appoint, the appointees would not be seated. Sir Wm. Crooks, in discussing the bread question, asserts that in the not very far distant future, the bread supply will run short. He bases his assertion on the fact that the demand constantly increases, while there is no more available territory on which to raise wheat. Evidently he never heard of the Pacific Northwest and the vast area of available wheat land not yet used.

The late reports from the Long Creek country are to the effect that the last installment of winter was one very fast. Feed cannot be had. It seems hard that such should occur right on the verge of a warm spring.

The volunteers down at Cuba are to be mustered out and sent home as fast as possible. This is a mistake, unless there are regulars mustered in as fast as it occurs. Cuba should be kept well in hand till the policy of the new government is firmly established.

This week the Oregon boys over at Manila tasted the hottest portion of the fight. It was a hot one, and the boys behaved in a way that makes every Oregonian's bosom swell with pride. They proved worthy of admiration.

As reports come from Manila, they pile up the information that the insurgents continue to get licked; and such as ought soon to reduce their strength until they will be unable to resist further.
