INDIAN RAIN-MAKING.

Conkley, Red Men Were Asked Their Views on the Weather.
All the Indian tribes that rain-makers call on, are asked, "What is the weather like?" The New York Tribune, a large body of Creek Indians had gathered, all decked out in their best finery. Two elderly men retired a short distance and seemed to be consulting for each other something. The prayers or incantations after some time a fire was made on the bank of the stream, when the two rain-makers gave an order and a young man plunged into the river, which was very deep. When he came up, he had a live catfish in his hand, which one of the old men took and threw into the fire, the tribe looking on in perfect silence. Then there was more rumbling, accompanied by various contortions and gestures, when the gathering dispersed, it rained that night. Perhaps, on the whole, the Indian rain-maker is more generally successful than the Christian one, especially in the case of the latter. In times of drought, the former having a shower and fire accompanied foretold of weather probabilities and putting in his incantations at the right time.

GIVES OFF LIGHT.
An Ever Active Glow Issues from a Recent Lecture at Vancouver.
In a recent lecture before the Royal Society Lord Kelvin vindicated the correctness of his early theories in relation to contact electricity. He showed that when a zinc plate and a copper plate are brought into contact with one another and then separated one was charged with positive electricity and the other with negative. He further demonstrated that this was not due to contact but to the difference of the electromotive force of the two metals of the day. Lord Kelvin exhibited other experiments illustrating electricity produced by means of dissimilar metals, and showed some curious properties possessed by water. If a plate of this metal was connected with an electromotive force and a plate of aluminum placed in contact with it, the water would gradually change past zero to negative. He also demonstrated that the rays given off by uranium in a dark room are a constant property of the substance and not a result of chemical action. He also showed that the rays previously called "beta" rays, have been identified as being due to the solution of the particles of the metal.
