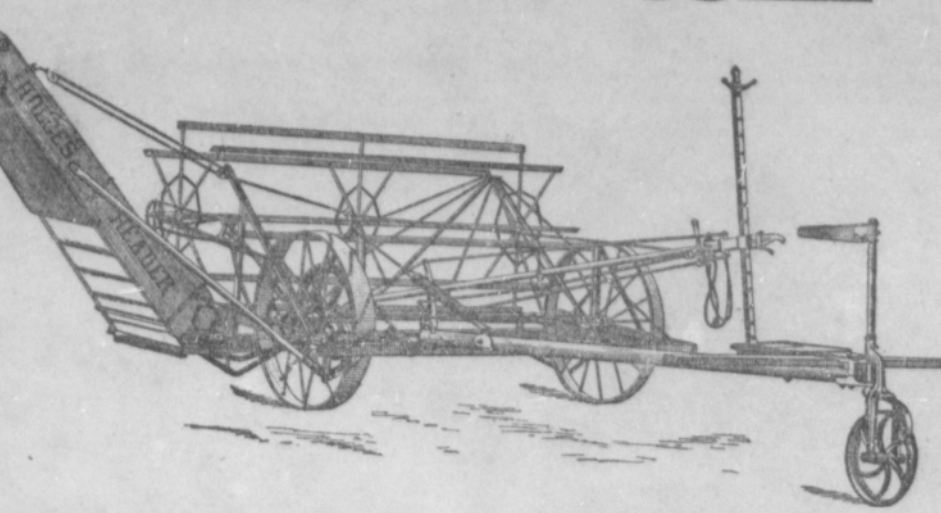

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ORDINANCE NO. 22

An ordinance to prevent the opening of houses, booths, tents, shops, offices, stores and other places for labor, traffic or amusement on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday or the Lord's Day, and prescribing penalties for violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the common council of the City of Wasco:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the City of Wasco to open any room, booth, tent, shop, office, store, building or other place for the purpose of labor, traffic or amusement on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday or the Lord's Day.

SEC. 2. That any person who shall violate any of the provisions of Section One of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by fine of not less than \$10 dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

SEC. 3. That the provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to the keepers of hotels, boarding or lodging houses, butcher shops, barber shops, bakeries, undertaking establishments, livery stables and doctor's offices; and it shall not be construed so as to prevent the opening of drug stores for the purpose of filling of prescriptions and dispensing medicine to the sick and their attending physicians.

SEC. 4. That in any prosecution under this ordinance any and all circumstances of necessity and mercy may be pleaded in mitigation and defense.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the marshal to see that the provisions of this ordinance are enforced.

SEC. 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately after its passage and publication.
