ORDINANCE NO. 30.

An ordinance defining the duties, and fixing the compensation of the Recorder of the City of Wasco, Regulating proceedings in the Recorder's Court and repealing ordinance No. 4 of said city.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASCO:

Section 1. That the Recorder of the city of Wasco, shall perform the duties prescribed in, and be governed by the provisions of an act of the Legislative Assembly of the state of Oregon, entitled "An act to incorporate the city of Wasco, Sherman county, Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of Secretary of state February 6th, 1905, commonly known and called the "Charter of said City" and laws amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, also the general laws of said state of Oregon which apply to the duties of his office, shall observe the ordinances of the said city and perform the duties prescribed thereby and his style of office shall be "Recorder."

Section 2. That all process issued by the Recorder shall be dated, signed by him as such officer, and directed to the Marshal of the city of Wasco. In all actions for the violation of ordinances of the city, the process shall run in the name of the city of Wasco, and in all actions before him as a Justice of the Peace, process shall run in the name of the state of Oregon.

Section 3. That the Recorder shall keep a docket in which he shall enter: The title of every action commenced in his court with a brief statement of the nature thereof or of the offense; the date of any warrant, summons, subpoena, writ, process or order, issued by him and the time for the return thereof; the appearance or default of defendant in a civil, and the arrangement and plea if a criminal action, every continuance granted at whose request and what time; the demand for a jury trial if any, by whom demanded, the deposit of the jury fee, and the names of the jurors impanelled the names, occupation, and address of all witnesses called and sworn and at whose request; the verdict, or if the jury disagree, then the fact of the disagreement, and discharge; the judgement rendered and the date thereof, and if appealed from, that fact, or if reviewed, that fact, and shall also state whether or not proceedings are stayed thereby; the payment of any judgement, fine, penalty or costs with the date thereof and the party by whom paid and the amount, and he may make such other entries and state such other facts as he shall deem necessary and proper to make the record accurate and plain, but all such records shall be brief and to the point and shall not be burdened with unnecessary statements, circumstances or explanations.

Section 4. That whenever any person shall file in his court a complaint charging any one with violation of a city ordinance, he shall issue a warrant of arrest stating the nature of the offense, directed to the Marshal requiring him to forthwith arrest the accused and bring him before the Recorder's Court to be dealt with according to law, which warrant of arrest may be substantially in the following form to wit:

To the Marshal of the City of Wasco:

Complaint under oath having been this day laid before me that the crime of—(Here state na-

ture of offense)—has been committed within said city, in violation of the provisions of Ordinance No.—thereof, and accusing—thereof, therefore,

IN THE NAME OF THE CITY OF WASCO,

you are hereby commanded to forthwith arrest the said— and bring him before this court to be dealt with according to law.

Section 5. That upon the return of the warrant, the person accused having been apprehended, the Recorder shall read to him the complaint and advise him of his right to employ counsel if he so desires and allow him a reasonable time so to do. If he does not desire counsel or if after waiting a reasonable time, he does not procure counsel, he shall be required to plead and the trial shall proceed.

Section 6. That whenever any person shall be arrested and brought before the Recorder's Court without a warrant having been issued, and accused of any offense, the officer or person making the arrest shall be examined under oath as to such accusation, and the substance of the charge entered in the docket, whereup all further proceedings shall be the same as if a warrant had been issued.

Section 7. That any defendant shall be entitled to process to secure the attendance of witnesses and to compel them to attend and to testify Subpoenas shall also be issued on the part of the city, or plaintiff, and process when deemed necessary, upon request of plaintiff, the officer or person making the arrest, or the City Attorney, requiring the attendance of witnesses in behalf of the city or party plaintiff, and to compel them to testify.

Section 8. That if the accused be convicted, and adjudged and sentenced to imprisonment, the judgement shall be executed by the issuing by the Recorder to the Marshal of a certified transcript of the judgement, to which shall be attached an order of commitment directed to the Marshal of the city of Wasco, requiring him to receive the defendant into his custody and to detain him in accordance therewith and with the requirements of said judgement.

Section 9. That whenever any person shall be committed to jail for the non payment of any fine or costs, or any portion thereof, an order shall be made directing and commanding that such person be required to labor upon the streets or public works of the city, under the direction and control of the city Marshal, or police force, one day for each two dollars of the said fine and costs.

Section 10. That if any person accused of an offense committed in violation of any ordinance of the city, shall enter a plea of not guilty, deposit the jury fee of six dollars and demand a jury trial, he shall be entitled to a trial by jury, and in such cases a jury shall be empanelled and the trial conducted as in similar actions in justices' courts, otherwise he shall be tried by the court.

Section 11. That jurors serving in the Recorder's court, shall be entitled to and shall receive the same fees as jurors in Justices' Courts.

Section 12. That all judgement for money fines, costs and disbursements rendered and entered in the Recorder's Court, shall be paid to the Recorder, who shall keep a proper account thereof, and shall without delay pay the same over to the proper officer or party.

Section 13. That the Recorder shall keep the accounts of all customers and patrons of the water and light system of the city receive and receipt for any and all money due from customers and patrons of said systems, when tendered at his office, and on the tenth day of each month, he shall make a list of the delinquents with the several amounts due, and deliver the same to Marshal and shall proceed as provided in the ordinance governing the said system, and shall perform such other duties in relation to the said water and light system as may be required by the Council or prescribed by ordinance.

He shall turn over without delay all moneys belonging to the city collected by him, with itemized statements showing the date and amount of each item collected, from whom and what for, and state to what fund each such item belongs.

Section 14. That at the quarter, the same ending March 3., June 30, and December 31st respectively, he shall prepare and submit a report in writing of the business of his office, which report shall show:

1st. The proceedings of his court in which the city is interested, the nature of the complaints, and if terminated the results.
2nd. The financial condition of the city; the warrants issued during the quarter, the warrants paid, and the warrants outstanding.
3rd. The cash received, with dates, sources and amounts, the amounts disbursed with date, to whom and for what, and the balance on hand if any.

4th. Any other information which he may deem proper and useful to the Council.

5th. Any recommendations or suggestions concerning the business of his office or the welfare of the city. And he shall not be entitled to a warrant for the quarter's salary until said report shall have been submitted and approved by the Council.

Section 15. That the recorder shall receive as compensation for his services, the sum of \$60.00 per quarter to be paid by warrant as other claims are paid, upon the approval of his report. He shall receive no other fees or compensation except in cases in which he acts as Justice of the Peace in proceedings in his court in which cases he shall be entitled to collect the fees allowed by law and retain the same as additional compensation.

Section 16. That Ordinance No. 4 of the city of Wasco, entitled "An Ordinance defining the duties and fixing the compensation of the Recorder of the city of Wasco, regulating proceedings in the Recorder's Court and repealing Ordinance No. 2 of said city," be and the same is hereby repealed.
