Bids will be received until Friday, July 13, 1906 at 6 o'clock P. M. and all bids will be opened at that time.

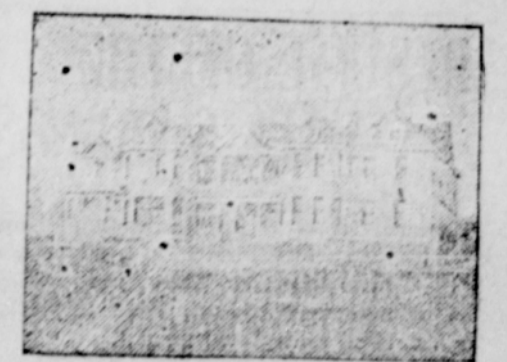
