

THE PORTAGE BUSY

Traffic to be Continued During the Winter Months

A Large Amount of Freight at the Portage Awaiting Shipment by Open River Steamers Soon to be Put in Operation.

According to C. E. Steelsmith, the new superintendent on the state portage road at Celilo, says the Chronicle, there will be considerable traffic going over that line throughout the winter months, on account of the large amount of cement and other building material shipped regularly to the contractors on the government canal at Celilo. Heavy shipments of the same sort of material will also have to be made by the water route by those engaged in building the north bank road.

Mr. Steelsmith came down from Celilo Saturday, and says he expects to have his hands full in looking after the portage traffic regardless of the fact that the boats operated by the Open River Transportation company have been taken out of service. He believes that it will not be a great while until these boats are again back on the run.

At present the scarcity of fuel has to be contended with, but this is expected to be only a temporary embarrassment.

When the new boat has been completed, Mr. Steelsmith declares, the company will run its boats on the upper part of the river to connect with her.

There are about 10,000 sacks of wheat lying at Celilo awaiting shipment to Portland.

Fish for Register.
