SEATTLE PINETH

FOR SLAB WOOD

pany, the largest operator of coal

A Darling Wasp.

Some wasps live in part upon honey,
which they collect from the most open
petaled flowers, and thus to a very
moderate extent they may be regarded
in the light of flower fertilizers. Kirk-
land says in the first volume of the
American Naturalist that "the paper
hornet (*Vespa maculata*) often enters
my nucleus hives when I am rearing
Italian queen bees and captures the
young queen in the midst of her little
colony, usually just after she has com-
menced her first laying. I have seen
this predator enter the small hive,
drag out the queen and fly away with
her to the woods" (page 52). Some of
the species of the genus pollsters store
up honey which is poisonous, from the
fact that it has been collected from
poisonous flowers. They are found in
South America, where also species of
the genus *chartegus* occur—wasps
that make a very remarkable and
tough nest, with funnel shaped combs
inside, arranged one inside of another,
nest fashion, but not in contact ex-
cept at their points of suspension. At
the apex of these cones occur the
apertures of entrance for the inmates
to pass up among the conical tiers.

To Patrons of Wasco Schools.

At the recent meeting of the legal vot-
ers of School District No. 7 (Wasco), it
was voted that tuition fees be charged
and collected on non-resident pupils as
follows:

Pupils in or under 4th grade, \$3;
those between 4th and 8th grades, \$4;
and those in or above the 8th grade, \$5
per term of 12 weeks. Teachers are re-
quired to attend to collection of above
fees.
