#### A Matter of Regret

Commissioner of Corporations Garfield has made his report to President Roosevelt regarding his investigations of the alleged criminal practices of the Standard Oil company in maintaining a monopoly of the oil business and, through the collusion of certain railroad companies, in the way of secret rebates, etc., robbing the people of many hundreds of thousands of dollars annually. The president has forwarded the report to congress accompanied by a message in which he makes a number of wise suggestions relative to measures of relief.
