### A Rich Strike

J. H. Adams, who has had a force of men at work at the Bloomfield mine in Joe Bar district, reports today that he has made one of the greatest strikes in the history of southern Oregon.

A tunnel 145 feet long has been run and where the vein is cut a width of 40 feet is in evidence. The values are in copper and gold. The sulphides ore assays 14 per cent copper and \$214 gold. The barren runs 42 per cent copper and \$10.20 per ton in gold. Mr. Adams is a mining man of large experience and will develop the property on a large scale.—Medford Tribune.

### To Water the Valley

A canal along the hillside for 135 miles, 400 feet above the Rogue River Valley, is what the High Line Ditch Company, with headquarters at Portland, hopes to have completed by this time next year. Milo P. Ward, a well known Portlander, has been engaged for seven years in financing the scheme, and has secured ample capital from Indianapolis to put the ditch through from the head-gates on upper Rogue River to where it will debouch into the same stream at Gold Hill, Jackson County.

"We have just bought the power plant at Gold Hill and have expended \$50,000 in the purchase and improvements," Mr. Ward said today, "and we have spent \$20,000 more on works at the head gates and on the first 20-mile section of the ditch, which is to be 20 feet wide and six feet deep, narrowing to 14 feet in width at its terminus. Contracts for digging the entire ditch will be let this summer, and the cost of construction is to be \$920,000.

"The high line ditch will supply water for irrigating, and placer mining to the farms and mines along its route, where water is badly needed at present. Gold in considerable quantity exists in the gravel bed below the line of the ditch and can be obtained by pipping from our canal. Besides this, new orchards, alfalfa beds and vegetable gardens will be cultivated where now land is too dry in the summer season for successful farming.

"The land along the hillside has been pronounced solid enough to hold water at such great height, and there is no fear of leaks or breaks in the banks. The high-line ditch will prove a blessing to a large section of Jackson County, which has hitherto suffered from lack of water in the dry months of Summer and early Fall."—Telegram.
