price, develop our resources and increase our wealth.

The Rogue River Valley Development league does not take the place of or conflict with any commercial body or any section of the valley, but its object is to aid and assist impartially every commercial body and every portion of the valley. How does it do this?

First—More money can be raised in the entire valley than in any one portion of it.

Second—This money will be expended for advertising and other purposes as the executive board, composed of men from all portions of the valley, shall decide.

Third—The advertising will be gotten up by committees from all parts of the valley, that everything may be fair and impartial.

Fourth—Supposing some one town should decide that it would rather do its own advertising; as a result, the homeseeker would come there and look over the town; next he would look over the rest of the valley, and might locate outside of the town doing the advertising. In this manner other towns and other sections reap the advantage without expense. It is for this very reason that each town and each section of the valley should donate its share of the total expense, that we may equally bear the burden and equally reap the reward.

Fifth—Copies of all letters and inquiries from homeseekers will be sent to each commercial organization in the valley; also a monthly statement of receipts and expenditures; also a full report of just what the league is doing.

Sixth—The league is working actively upon the following important things:

1. The opening up and sale of railroad lands.
2. The lessening of freight rates.
3. The building of new railroads.
4. The building of good roads in the valley and of a macadamized road from Portland to the California line (in connection with other counties) to connect with the California macadamized road to San Diego.
5. Water for irrigation and pure water supply for towns and villages.
6. A system of parks and swimming tanks for towns and villages, together with gymnasium apparatus for the physical culture of children, and various amusement devices to keep children off the streets.
7. Training schools for the different trades; horticulture, gardening, business colleges, cooking schools, and domestic science for the girls.

If you have any inquiries to make, if you have any suggestions to make, if you know or hear of anything that is good for the outside world to know, if you have \$2.50 to spare, send it in today to the president or secretary of the Rogue River Valley Development league. Write letters and send in petitions to your county judge and commissioners. Ask them to appropriate at least \$2,000 for the advertising and benefit of the valley. Stop knocking, and become a "Booster," thereby increasing your happiness and wealth and that of your neighbor and country. "Just try it for a week and you will ever thereafter be a 'Booster.'"

Now, All together! All the time! Pull together for the United Rogue River Valley.
