Report of Central Point public school for the month ending Dec. 1, 1906:

Number of days taught 16; days attendance 3558; days absent, boys 96, girls 90, total 186; tardy, boys 38, girls 28, total 66; number enrolled on register, boys 112, girls 136, total 248; average daily attendance 222; percent of attendance 964; number of visitors 5; number of cases of corporal punishment 0.
