

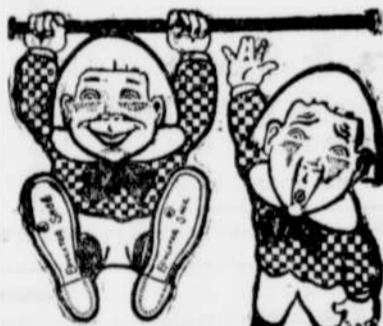
**Knights and Ladies of Security Install Officers.**

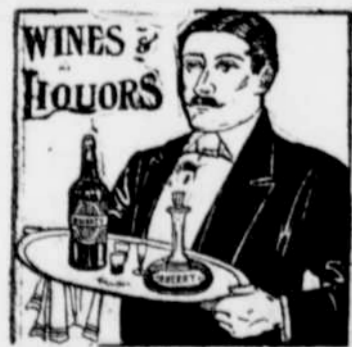
