MRS. DUNIWAY ON PROHIBITION.

It is rather peculiar, to say the least, that a majority of the counties of Oregon should vote "dry" at the late election by decisive majorities and that the Equal Suffrage amendment, which proposed to give the elective franchise to the women of Oregon, should be overwhelmingly defeated. It is generally conceded that the ladies, if invested with the voting power, would ordinarily cast their ballots on the side of temperance and good morals, and just why the men who so earnestly worked and voted for prohibition should vote against the equal suffrage amendment is a hard nut to crack. Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway, the venerable leader of the equal suffrage movement in Oregon and one of the noblest and most honored members of her sex, attributes the failure of the amendment to the combined efforts of the liquor interests and the prohibition leaders, both of whom, she says, will find themselves out of a job soon after women are allowed to vote. In a letter to the Portland Oregonian two days after the election Mrs. Duniway says in part:

"I see little prospect of the enfranchisement of women until the present liquor craze has run its course. The agitators of both sexes who live by inciting hate, duplicity, revenge, over-indulgence in intoxication and every other evil that grows out of attempts to make people good by legislation, will find their occupation gone soon after women are allowed to vote. Knowing this, said agitators fight equal rights for women in the interests of their salaries, and for the same identical reason, the whiskey league is fighting us. But they'll fight each other to a finish by and by. Then they'll be able, let us hope, to cease trailing women behind whisky barrels in the interest of sex or gender suffrage, of which every enlightened and honorable man is already ashamed."

Every citizen of Southern Oregon who loves to cast a fly or drop a bait for the festive trout should speedily use his influence in the direction of protecting the fish streams in this section of the state. Reports from almost every locality show that trout are being killed by the thousands because of the lack of proper screens at the headgates of the irrigation ditches. Trout from two to six inches long are found every day in the laterals at the Snowy Butte orchard here at Central Point, the water in which comes from the Fish Lake canal. The state laws require every headgate to be screened, so as to prevent the fishes entering the ditches, and it is certainly time the law was enforced. Fishermen report fish scarcer in Rogue River and its tributaries this season than ever before, and if this wholesale destruction of young fish is not stopped, fishing either for sport or profit will soon be a thing of the past in Southern Oregon. The attention of Fish Warden McAllister should be called to this condition without delay.
