To Oregon Teachers:—The National Educational Association will hold its next session at Cleveland, Ohio, June 29 to July 3, inclusive, and a goodly attendance from Oregon is desired. Rates to said meeting are as follows:

First—From all O. R. & N. points, the round trip fare to Chicago selling dates, June 19 and 20, will be \$72.50.

Second—From points on the S. P. Oregon lines, the rates will vary according to the distance the starting point is from Portland.

Third—Tickets from both O. R. & N. and S. P. territory will carry a going limit of ten days, with a final return limit of ninety days, and include stop-over privileges in both directions within the limits.

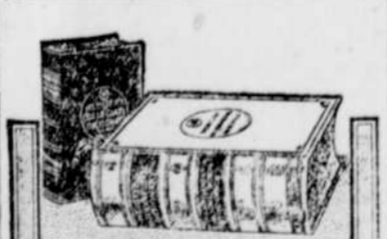
