School began September 14th, with the following teachers: Mrs. Purkeypile, 1st grade; Miss Murphy, 2nd-3rd grades; Miss Tompson, 4th grade; Miss Chapman, 5th grade; Miss Aiken, 6th grade; Miss Mahn, 7th-8th grades; Prof. Cooper, high school.

School started with an enrollment of 215 pupils and increased to 258 during the first month. The school is badly crowded, especially in the 1st, 7th and 8th grades, there being only enough space in those class rooms for the teachers to turn around. There is an enrollment of 27 in the high school and it is expected to be run up to 35 shortly.

All the pupils are working earnestly and all prospects are for good work this year.

Beatrice and Merrit Hoagland have quit school, as they will leave shortly with their parents to make their home in California.

So far three societies have been organized, namely: Central Point High School Debating Society, the officers of which are: President, Kenneth Barnett; vice-president, Paul Norcross; secretary-treasurer, Josephine Houston. Ladies' Athletic Association, with Prof. Cooper as manager and Mabel Peart secretary-treasurer. Boys' Athletic Association, with Tom Kincaid as manager. All of the societies make the literary work a special feature.

Kill Big Cougar.

The Coumar boys, who reside between this place and Jacksonville, killed a 7-foot cougar last Saturday while hunting in the mountains south of the county seat. One of the hunters shot the animal in a tree and brought him to the ground, making apparently a dead shot. PETITION FOR LIQUOR LICENSE.

Woodville Precinct, Jackson County, Oregon:—
