Portland, Oregon, October 26, 1908. (Special Correspondence.) Assistant Secretary J. E. Wilson of the United States Department of the Interior and Mr. W. M. Geddes of the Treasury Department, Washington, D. C., were guests at the Portland Commercial Club last Saturday. They are making a tour of the Northwest.

"The Fruit Grower," of St. Joseph, Missouri, has just issued a Home-seekers' Edition, which contains an extended report from all the fruit growing districts of the West, and no one state receives as much attention as Oregon. There is page after page of illustration and text, and every part of the state is given prominence. In fact, Oregon probably gets more attention than any other two states. This is true because the state is better organized, doing better advertising, has more good pictures and has learned how to present its resources and attractions better than any other state in the Union.

No more beautiful publication has been issued in Oregon than the one just from the press which gives most graphically the resources and attractions of Lincoln County. **Clear Stump Land—New Process.**

Larry Nolan, one of the leading farmers in the town of Newbold, has invented a process for pulling stumps which promises to be of untold value to farmers of the country. His method, which has already attracted widespread attention, is as follows: With a two-inch auger, bore a hole perpendicularly into the stump about two feet; pour into this hole one pint of equal parts of nitric and sulphuric acids; plug the hole tightly with a plug dipped in melted paraffine. In thirty days' time the stump so treated will be a charred, pulpy mass, roots and all, and may be spread over the soil as a fertilizer with a shovel. Mr. Nolan has just stumped 16 acres of land on his Newbold farm in this manner at a cost of four cents cash and five minutes' labor per stump. The John R. Davis Lumber Company at Phillips has adopted Mr. Nolan's process in clearing several hundred acres of land in Price county.—Prentice Calumet.

Coss, the Medford piano man, who was recently found guilty in the Jackson county Circuit Court on a statutory charge, was this week sentenced to serve seven years at hard labor in the penitentiary. He was taken to Salem in charge of Sheriff Jones on Tuesday evening, but in the meantime the prisoners counsel, Colvig and Reams, had called upon the governor and laid the case before him with the results that when the sheriff arrived at the door of the prison with his charge he was met with an order from the governor, directing him to take his prisoner back to the Jackson county jail, the attorneys having secured a stay of execution.
