Last Thursday Mayor Fred H Hopkins, owner of the famous Snowy Butte orchards, received returns from his 1908 crop of Winter Nellis pears, which had been consigned to Rae & Hatfield commission merchants of New York City, showing the record price for the year in the world's markets of \$2.37 per half box, or \$4.75 per full box. The car brought \$1765.45.

### Well Known Orchardists Invest Here.

Last Thursday witnessed two important orchard sales in this immediate vicinity, the prices paid showing that there is no pause in the advancing values of choice fruit lands in the Central Point section.

C. H. Lewis, who recently sold the Bear Creek orchards, near Medford, for the record price of \$185,000, closed a deal on the date above named for the Beall 40-acre tract, one and one-half miles north of this place and just east of Bear creek, the price being \$20,000, or \$500 an acre. This place contains 30 acres of five and six year old trees and ten acres in alfalfa. This place was sold by Mr. Beall about a year ago to the Rogue River Land Co. for \$9,000, and last Spring it was sold by that company to Glasgow & English for \$15,000, and this latest sale at \$20,000 shows an advance of more than 100 per cent in 12 months.

On the same day F. L. TouVelle, who also recently sold a fine orchard near Medford, closed a deal for the Wiseman place, two miles northwest from this place. The place contains 142 acres and the price paid was \$22,000. There is 12 acres of young trees on the place, the balance being in farm land and alfalfa. Mr. TouVelle expects to plant 27 acres more to trees this winter.

Commenting on these sales the Medford Tribune says:

"Both Messrs. Lewis and TouVelle have owned the finest orchards in the valley and hold the record for high prices for fruit and determined to re-invest, and consider the part where they have bought the choicest fruit land in the valley."
