Corvallis has recently organized a woman's auxiliary that will make itself felt in many ways in furthering the efforts of the local commercial club in advertising Corvallis. A warm welcome is given newcomers.

Silverton people, at a meeting during the past week, raised a fund of over \$2000 that will be still further increased. A strong commercial club has been organized with over 40 members and it is promised this number will be raised to 100 soon.

Scio and Jefferson are in line for their share of publicity, having each raised \$600 for development work in their section. All are alive to the benefits of working together as a state league.

The Cookbook.

When frying mush, dip the slices first in the white of an egg. This makes it crisp.

Mashed potatoes should be run through a vegetable press as soon as boiled. After dressing they should be beaten with a fork until light.

Keeping vegetables in the cooking water after they are done spoils both looks and taste. After pouring water off, return to fire for a minute to dry off before dressing.

Rich pie crust is often cut into long, thin strips and browned in the oven, spread with a layer of jam and then with whipped cream. After spreading, place every two strips together, sandwich fashion, and serve.
