The Open Top Tree. It is not necessary to go over the tree trying to cut off every little twig. The leaders are the ones that need at-tention. When beading in these leaders it is best to cut them off to a side branch rather than to dormant bud. Frequently when an inexperienced man practices heading in he is tempted to shear the tree all over and leave it a smooth, oval form. It will be seen that this is very different from the method described above, where only the leaders are cut back and the open top.
