### THE STATE OF SISKIYOU

The recent action of the Jackson County Press association endorsing the movement for the erection of the new state of Siskiyou is arousing plenty of comment from Frisco to Portland. As was to be expected the Portland Oregonian, oracle of the mossbacks and reactionaries all along the coast, threw a cat fit and has hardly had a full breath since. The awfulness of so much as suggesting something new, something that the Oregonian has not been intimately acquainted with for the past 50-odd years is too much for the nerves of that finicky old journalistic lady and she should be granted a license to "holler" at least to the extent of relieving her pent-up feelings. The Portland Journal takes an entirely different view of the situation.
