### Ordinance No. 67.

An ordinance creating and establishing Trunk Sewer District No. 1 in the city of Central Point, Oregon, and defining the boundaries thereof.

The people of the City of Central Point do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the district included within the following boundaries in the City of Central Point, Oregon, is hereby established as and declared to be and comprise Trunk Sewer District No. 1, to-wit:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the present city boundary of said city, and running thence west on said boundary 2260 feet more or less; thence in a southwesterly direction parallel with and 140 feet distant from the north line of Hazel street to the north line of Oak Park addition to the City of Central Point; thence west on said line to the west line of the Oregon and California Railroad company's right of way; thence southeasterly on said west line to the center line of Cherry street, produced; thence southwesterly along said last mentioned line to the west boundary of said city; thence starting south on said west boundary and following said boundary through all of its changes of direction around the south and east sides of said city to the place of beginning.

Section 2. Said Trunk Sewer District No. 1 is hereby created as and declared to be a special benefit district, the whole thereof being equally benefited by the trunk sewer constructed for the drainage of said city, and it is hereby declared and ordered that the total cost of said trunk sewer be apportioned and assessed equally against all of the property in said district.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the common council October 10th, 1911, by the following vote: Lindsay, yes; Myers, yes; Dunlap, yes; Peart, yes; Grim, yes; Whiteside, yes.

### Ordinance No. 68.

An ordinance creating and establishing lateral sewer district No. 1 and lateral sewer district No. 2 in the City of Central Point, Oregon, and defining the boundaries of each of said districts.

The people of the City of Central Point do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the district included within the following boundaries in the City of Central Point, Oregon, is hereby established as and declared to be and comprise lateral sewer district No. 1, to-wit:

Lots numbered one (1), two (2), three (3) and the east half of lots numbered four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7), and eight (8) in block numbered fifteen (15); the north half of block numbered ten (10); the north half of block numbered seven (7); the north half of block numbered two (2); the north half of block numbered forty-one (41); lots numbered one (1), three (3), and four (4), in block numbered forty-two (42); the south half of block numbered forty-eight (48); the south half of block numbered forty-nine (49); lots numbered nine (9), ten (10), eleven (11), twelve (12), thirteen (13) and fourteen (14) in block numbered three (3); the south half of block numbered six (6); the south half of block numbered eleven (11); lots numbered fourteen (14), fifteen (15) and sixteen (16) in block numbered fourteen (14), all according to the duly recorded map or plat of the Town of Central Point, Oregon.

Section 2. Said lateral sewer district No. 1 is hereby created as and declared to be a special benefit district, the whole thereof being equally benefited by the lateral sewers constructed therein by said city, and it is hereby declared and ordered that the total cost of said lateral sewers be apportioned and assessed equally against all of the property in said district.

Section 3. The district included within the following boundaries in the City of Central Point, Oregon, excepting therefrom the property described in section 1 of this ordinance as comprising lateral sewer district No. 1, is hereby established as and declared to be and comprise lateral sewer district No. 2, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north line of Hazel street, in said city, with the north boundary of said city, and running thence west 240 feet more or less; thence southwesterly parallel with and 140 feet distant from the north line of Hazel street to the center line of Third street; thence south and southeasterly along said center line to the center of the alley between Hazel and Cherry streets; thence southwesterly along the center line of said alley to the west boundary line of block 74; thence south to the north line of Oak Park addition extended; thence west on said line to

the east line of the right of way of the Oregon and California railroad; thence southeasterly along said line last mentioned, to the south line of lot 6 in block 8 in Oak Park addition to said city; thence southwesterly to the intersection of the center line of the alley through block 2 in Amy and Harbaugh's addition to said city with the south line of the county road; thence southeasterly along the center line of said alley, extended, to the center line of the alley through block 7 in said last mentioned addition; thence southwesterly along the center line of said alley to the center of Haskell street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Haskell street to a point midway between Pine and Oak streets; thence at right angles, northeasterly to a point midway between Haskell street and Railroad alley; thence southeasterly, parallel with the center line of the Southern Pacific railroad to the south city boundary; thence east along said boundary to its intersection with the center line of the alley through block 19 in the original townsite; thence northwesterly along said center line to the center of said block 19; thence northeasterly to the intersection of the center line of the alley through block 22 in said townsite with the westerly line of lot 8 in said block 22, extended, thence southeasterly on said westerly line of lot 8 extended, to the center line of Bush street; thence northeasterly along said center line to a point 140 feet southwesterly from the west line of Fourth street; thence southeasterly and south parallel with and 140 feet distant from the west line of Fourth street to the south city boundary; thence east along said boundary to the west line of lot 25 in block 1 in Grand View addition to Central Point, extended; thence north on said line to the center line of the alley through said block 1; thence east 50 feet; thence north to the center line of the alley through block 2 in said addition; thence west 100 feet; thence north to the line between lots 11 and 14 in Constant addition to Central Point; thence east to the east city boundary; thence north to the north line of Constant addition; hence west to the northwest corner of said addition; thence north to the east line of Seventh street; thence northwesterly along said east line to the south line of Alder street, extended; thence northeasterly along said south line extended, 100 feet, more or less; thence north 65 feet more or less; thence southwesterly parallel with and 55 feet distant from said south line of Alder street, extended, to the east line of Seventh street; thence northwesterly along said east line to the south line of Oak street; thence northeasterly on the south line of Oak street, extended, 110 feet; thence northwesterly parallel with the east line of Seventh street to the center of the alley through block 1, Griffith's addition to Central Point; thence northeasterly along said center line to the center line of Tenth street extended; thence northwesterly on said last mentioned line to the north line of Pine street; thence easterly on said north line 87 feet; thence northwesterly parallel with and 55 feet distant from the east line of Tenth street to the north line of Manzanita street extended; thence southwesterly to the center line of Tenth street extended; thence northwesterly on said line to a point midway between Manzanita and Laurel streets extended; thence southwesterly to the southwest corner of D. L. C. 55, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, W. M.; thence north on said line to the center of Ninth street; thence northwesterly on center line of Ninth street to a point midway between Hazel and Cherry streets; thence northeasterly parallel with said center line to the center of the county road; thence northwesterly on said line to the north city boundary; thence west on said boundary to the place of beginning.

Section 4. Said lateral sewer district No. 2 is hereby created as and declared to be a special benefit district, the whole thereof being equally benefited by the lateral sewers constructed therein by said city, and it is hereby declared and ordered that the total cost of said lateral sewers be apportioned and assessed equally against all of the property in said district.
