

Ordinance No. 76.

An ordinance declaring the cost of the improvement of Pine street from Sixth street to the east side of Tenth street, and assessing the property benefited thereby and declaring such assessment and directing the entry thereof in the docket of city liens.

The people of the City of Central Point do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That no protests having been filed against the improvement of Pine street from Sixth street to the east side of Tenth street, due notice of the intention of the council to cause said improvement to be made having been given and said improvement having been ordered made, the council, having considered the matter, herewith ascertains the cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$9250.00.
