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# DUMMY ENTRYMEN MAY BE EMPLOYED

Corporations' Right to Make Agreement to Acquire Title Upheid by Court.

San Francisco .- That the offer of a corporation to purchase land from prospective entrymen as soon as the latter have complied with provisions necessary to obtain from the government title to such lands is legal, is the gist of a ruling made by W. B. Slibert, judge in the United States circuit court of appeals.

The case decided was that of the government against the Barber Lumber company and others for alleged conspiracy to defraud the government of large tracts of timber lands in Idaho by the use of "dummy entrymen." Judge Gilbert said:

"The decision of the present case is ruled by legal principles announced In the Budd case and in the Clark case. Those decisions are authority for the proposition that a person or corporation desiring to acquire title to a large body of timber lands of the United States under the timber and stone act may express that desire by another, and may enter into an agree ment with him to huy lands upon his obtaining title thereto, and may lend him the money with which to acquire title."

The case grew out of the filing ef applications by 210 entrymen on Boise Basin, Crooked River and Six-Four lands in Idaho in 1901-2.
