Jacksonville Man Accidentally Killed

John D. Margreiter was found lying in the snow last Sunday, February 25, in the yard of his home, three miles south of Jacksonville, with a jagged gun shot wound in his head and a 38-40 Winchester rifle beside him. A party of friends had gathered at his home and when the festivities were over Mr. Margreiter was awaiting a guest who he was to escort over the mountains. He had taken his rifle as a precaution against wild game and in some manner the gun was accidentally discharged, killing him instantly.

Coroner Perl and Sheriff Jennings arrived on the scene at 3.00 a. m. and after questioning friends and relatives the theory was accepted that the shooting was accidental.

Margreiter was 29 years of age and had lived all his life in Jackson county.

GRAND JURY INDICTMENTS.

The new grand jury which was drawn Monday morning completed its sessions in the afternoon, returning one indictment. Among other matters an investigation was conducted into the alleged violations of the prohibition law. No results were obtained.

Attorney J. A. Lemery, of Ashland, was indicted on a charge of attempting to extort money from George O. Van Natta. He is well known throughout the county as the result of being a candidate for prosecuting attorney a couple of years ago.

The hearings of the petit jury will begin this morning. There are four criminal cases to be heard.
