### Taxes are Due

The first half of state, county and city taxes are now due and will become delinquent April 5th. If not paid on or before that date, the amount due carries interest at 1 1/2 per cent per month to November 5th, when a penalty of 5 per cent is added.

Taxes may be paid here at the Central Point State Bank. In order to prevent the usual loss of money suffered by the banks who have heretofore handled the collections gratis, a charge of 15c will be made for each collection to protect the banks.
