Mrs. Mitchell and Miss Vera, of the Meadows, were trading at Beagle Saturday.

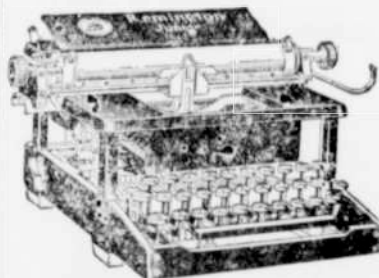
Mr. Stacy is doing some grading on our roads around the Beagle district. We are all glad to see better roads.
