THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND MARRIED WOMEN.

According to a dispatch from Salem, which is produced elsewhere in this issue, we note that Secretary of State Hal Hoss has made the announcement that he will hire no more married women in his department. To this sentiment we wish to shout—Amen!

That is, no doubt, a daring stand to take today, when women are in the ascendancy and are fast asserting themselves in all forms of industry. Yet, we believe with Hoss, that it is a wise rule to discontinue the service of the married women who has a husband capable of supporting her. The employment of as many married women as are now employed in various capacities does much damage to the institution of the home as well as to the industrial condition of the country. Wherever a married woman is employed there is the possibility of a living for the head of one family shattered, that another family might have two sources of revenue. As a rule, where both a man and his wife are working, there is little or no real home life, while if the same jobs were held by two men there could be two homes and two families.

This idea, perhaps, will be branded as old fashioned and in poor taste considering the present trend of the times—but we believe that it is logical and very little study is necessary to prove it to ones self. Take for instance, in the schools, every year our daughters and sons are graduated from normal schools to become teachers but cannot get employment because the positions are taken by married women. We may be a trifle wrong on this subject but we cannot help but feel that should the married woman fill the position which she should, that of housekeeper and mother—the greatest profession of them all—and leave the industrial field open to the single women and the men, the country would be a lot better off and there would be many more happy homes and contented people. In making these remarks we do not hold to the old fashioned idea that women should be a slave in the home, with no privileges, save that of serving her husband. We do not believe that for one minute—that condition is even worse than the present one. We believe that all women should have a profession or a means of earning a living, should necessity call, but that after assuming the roll of wife she should give her time to the duties and pleasures which come from that position.

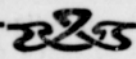

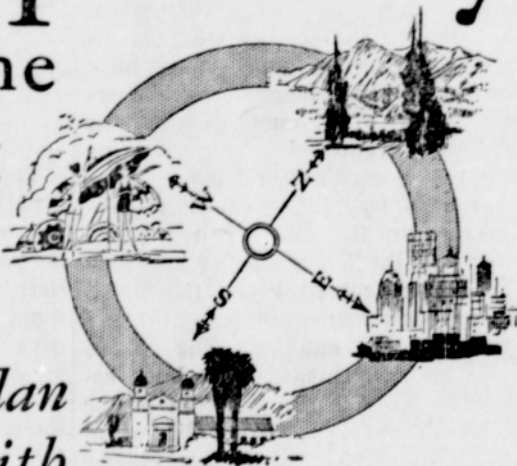
