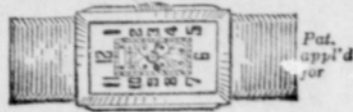

Barnes Circus is Coming To Medford Next Thursday

A REAL BIRTHDAY GIFT

It is the old, old custom that birthdays bring gifts to those celebrating such anniversaries but we find this is reversed in connection with the 60th anniversary of the Southern Pacific.

On their anniversary, May 10th, the Southern Pacific are going to give rather than receive and will extend to their patrons the opportunity of traveling between any two points on their Pacific System Lines for 60% of the one-way fare.

As Mr. Ormandy points out, the one-way fare to Portland is \$11.31, but if you go May 10th you can buy a round trip ticket for \$6.80. Likewise to San Francisco the one-way fare is \$15.66 but on Friday next, the return ticket to San Francisco will cost but \$9.40. Return portion of the ticket is limited to midnight, May 14th.

Tickets may be purchased at any time prior to and including the 10th and it is suggested that those requiring reservations make them without delay.

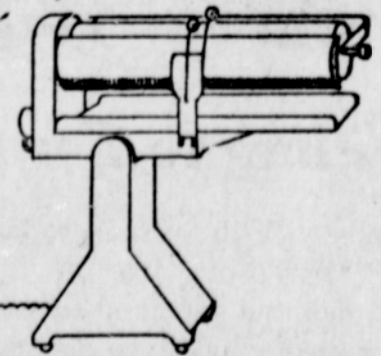
