When legumberries or other
bramble fruits have been infected
with Antiracnose, and control
measures were not taken after the
last harvest, or where the disease

was severe enough to require addi-
tional attention, it is advisable to
spray the new growth in the spring,
says the Oregon Experimental sta-
tion. Use bordeaux 4-4-50 as the
earliest new leaves are approaching
full size, repeating just before
bloom if necessary.
