The Jackson County Health Department with the assistance of the Jackson County Health Association and several other organizations vitally interested in public health is putting on an intensive campaign to find all early or suspicious cases of Tuberculosis.

The system to be used in finding these cases or in eliminating healthy ones from suspicion is as follows: During this week we have been and will continue to do so next week giving the very simple tuberculin test to every child available. Let me diverge a moment and say what this tuberculin test is. The test consists of putting a very minute quantity of tuberculin material just in the top layer of the skin. This material contains no serum or other animal product and in giving it, no pain is experienced nor is there any reaction or after effect to the child. In 48 hours we look at the child's forearm again and if the reaction is positive, there will be a small area of redness where the test has been given. If the test is negative nothing will be seen. The meaning of the reactions are: if the reaction is positive, it shows that the child has at some time during his life been infected with germ of tuberculosis and gotten over it or else it is now infected with germ of Tuberculosis. If reaction is negative it shows that the child has always been and is now free from tuberculous infection to any detectable extent. Now after we get a positive reaction we would be very silly to let it go at that, therefore we

want to proceed further and find out whether or not the child has a tuberculosis infection at this time, because if we find infection we can save that child and also keep it from spreading the infection to other children or adults. Therefore, as soon as we get a positive reaction we must take an x-ray of the child's chest and have this film thoroughly examined by an expert on Tuberculosis. This expert happens to be Dr. G. C. Bellinger, head of the Oregon State Tuberculosis Hospital who is nationally known for his knowledge of childhood tuberculosis. Upon getting these plates, Dr. Bellinger will send us a notice of what he finds in the child's chest and if he notes anything suspicious of tuberculosis, that child will be scheduled for the most thorough and complete physical examination possible. This examination to be done at the clinic to be held in the city of Medford, May 14 and 15th by Dr. G. C. Bellinger. Incidentally I wish to say that this clinic is to be conducted for children only and no adults will be examined or diagnosed.

The services of Dr. Bellinger, his expenses and the forms used are made possible through the sale of Christmas seals, and contributions to the Tuberculosis Association, which in this county is the Jackson County Health Association.

Jackson County is pioneering in this great drive against Tuberculosis and we are following an outline or plan promulgated by the most internationally known cooperation

Personal Interviews

Dr. Wilson, County Health officer: "I am glad to find that so many people are taking advantage of the low prices offered by the physicians of Jackson County in giving toxin antitoxin for Diphtheria and vaccination against Smallpox, and at the rate people have been responding to this offer, we can anticipate a very low incidence of Diphtheria and Smallpox next winter.

The physicians of Jackson County have offered to give the 3 toxin antitoxin immunizations for Diphtheria and vaccinate against Smallpox for the total cost of only \$2.50. This is the best public health spirit I have ever seen displayed by a group of physicians."

"If a child has had neither toxin antitoxin or been vaccinated both of these preventatives will have to be taken to get the advantage of this low rate but if the child has had toxin antitoxin then the vaccination will cost only 50 cents and if it has been vaccinated, then the 3 complete doses of Toxin antitoxin will be \$2."

Dr. E. B. Pickel—"This is sure a fine thing for Jackson County and hope that everyone takes advantage of it that can."

Dr. F. D. Stricker State Health Officer: "A great idea and is surely a step in advance for Jackson county. I hope other counties will successfully carry out this idea."

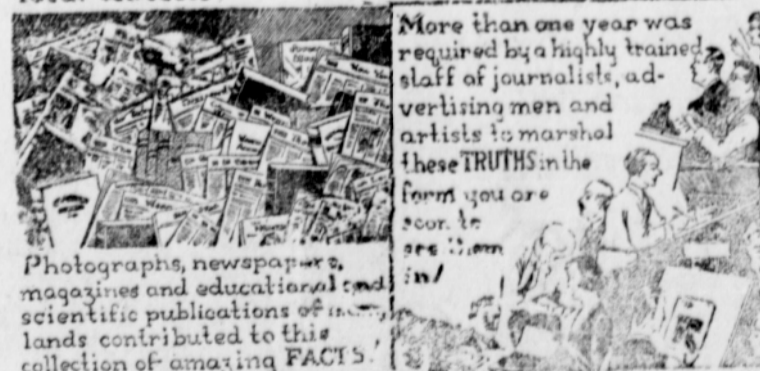
