A small but very interested group of local persons attended the Public Hearing for the proposed Housing Code for the City of Jacksonville. This Code would enable the local officials to bring older constructed homes up to minimum standard--many being inadequately wired, heated, plumbed, causing a fire and health hazard. With the thought upper-most in mind, City Officials are mindful of the many residents to whom adoption of such a Code might create a hardship, and wish to announce that they will make every effort to make whatever exception possible (within reason) in enforcement of the Code ordinance, upon adoption.

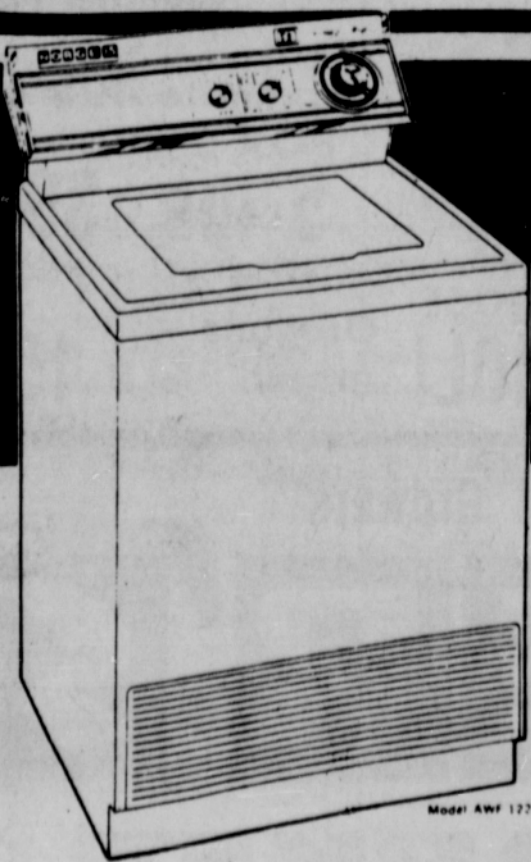
